Though presently stationed in Kuwait, the first 6 ½ months of my mid-east deployment was spent in Qatar, a small country bordering Saudi Arabia. Having the opportunity to venture off base, I thought I would share some driving news with my fellow car club members at home. As one would expect, there are a great many foreign cars here with Toyota and Mitsubishi leading the group, although Nissan is also well represented. There are quite a few trucks by Mazda and Isuzu. I also saw a Daihtsu truck, which is a brand that I am not familiar with. Land Cruisers are very popular in Qatar as they make excellent vehicles traversing sand dunes. Here they should be renamed Sand Cruisers. The typical yellow school bus here is either a Chevrolet or GMC, and I did see a Jeep, Pontiac Tempest and a Cadillac, so America is represented.

Though most road signs are in Arabic, a number have English as well. What we call "speed bumps" at home are referred to as "speed humps" in Qatar.

A sign which says "no overtaking" here is our equivalent to "do not pass." Detours in Qatar are called diversions, and our yield sign is written as "give way."

The typical highway speed limit here is 120 kilometers for cars and 80 kilometers for trucks though, in reality, one travels as fast as one dares. Roundabouts substitute for traffic lights and are a adventure in themselves. I would pay to see Bill Stump enter one of those roundabouts in his 1923 Model T Ford.



Finally, the equivalent of our deer crossing sign in Pennsylvania would be the camel crossing sign in Qatar. One of those beasts can seriously damage a car and there is a hefty fine here if you hit one. That is all for now from the Western Pennsylvania Region's Middle East news correspondent.
