





Tuesday, June 8, Heading South to Fayette County

Fort Necessity National Battlefield Visitors Center

After a coffee stop at the Country Pie Shoppe & Old

General Store in Donegal, PA we follow PA Scenic Route 381 South to Route 40. Here a thoroughfare of American History comes alive. The Fort Necessity National Battlefield & Visitors Center are part of the



U.S. National Park System. At this "Great Meadow" in July of 1754 a twenty two-year-old George Washington surrendered British forces under his command to the French after an overwhelming battle that marked the beginning of the French and Indian War.

The exciting new Fort Necessity Visitors Center offers an outstanding interpretive experience, which rivals anything Disney World has to offer. There is also an accurate recreation of Washington's hastily-made fort.

Car buffs will enjoy the exhibition on the history of U.S Route 40, "The National Road", which was Washington's vision for a road that would eventually unite the country.

Wild Side & Nemacolin Woodlands Resort

South of Fort Necessity along Route 40 is our lunch stop at Wild Side. This huge family fun center features a wide variety of entertainment including dozens of video games, pinball machines, a bowling alley and climbing wall.

There is even a mountain in the center of the building which show-cases some extraordinary examples of wildlife taxidermy. Near the entrance is a large, highly-detailed model railroad exhibit.



After leaving the Wild Side enjoy a drive through the grounds of the fabulous Nemacolin Woodlands Resort. Stop and visit resort owner Joe Hardy's collection of classic cars and airplanes. Spot fine art sculptures along the resort's roadways. There's even a drive through zoo.

Laurel Caverns

Traveling north on Route 40 from Nemacolin Woodlands we motor back along Skyline Drive at the top of the "mountain" to Laurel Caverns. There is a spectacular view from the Visitor Center's porch. But the real treat is a walking underground tour of Pennsylvania's largest cave.

Laurel Caverns is a unique sandstone cave and features formations

different from typical limestone caves. Wear good walking shoes with some decent tread on them. The temperature is 55 degrees year round. So you may also want to wear a light jacket in the cave.


