There were 54 members in attendance and no guests.

Minutes of the June 21, 2011 Meeting

The minutes of the June 21, 2011 meeting were printed in the June *Round-Up*. President Eger asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes. Hearing none, the President called for a motion to approve the minutes.

Upon motion of Ron Underwood, seconded by Dominic Surace and unanimously carried, the minutes of the June 21, 2011 meeting were approved.

Treasurers Report

Craig DeFloria presented the Treasurers Report. A motion to accept the report as presented was made by Dominic Surace, seconded by Denny Blank, and unanimously carried. The Treasurers Report was approved.

OLD BUSINESS

2011 Westmoreland Arts & Heritage Festival Spot

President Eger addressed the reasons why the Region received the bad spot for selling Chance Car tickets at the Westmoreland Arts & Heritage Festival this year. He had delayed in getting the 2011 application to the Festival. In the mean time the Festival took in a large contributor who wanted the Region's usual space on top of the lower lake dam breast. He offered his apologies and stated that next year's application will be turned in this fall. We hope to get our old spot back.

Membership - Howard Finney

Howard called Anthony Fallone about attending the July meeting and he did not show.

Tours - Mark Jackson

Progressive Dinner Tour - Mark reported that the Progressive Dinner Tour will be Saturday, August 20th and that a registration flyer is in the *Round-Up*. Cost is \$15. per member, \$20. per guest. Members would receive a \$10 rebate when they arrive for breakfast. Tour directions will be mailed when registrations are received.

Mark then acknowledged and thanked this year's Progressive Dinner dining stop hosts: Charlie and Connie Schifano - breakfast; Harvey and Susan Eger - salad; Mark and Jill Jackson - dinner; John and Vicki Kuhns - dessert.

Charlie Schifano then stated that had he known that there were fees of \$15. and \$20. involved in the 2011 Progressive Dinner Tour that he probably would have not offered to participate in it. He also commented that the *Round-Up* newsletter, which carries information on such items, has not been timely. It should be received by members one week before each

monthly meeting, not distributed at the meeting. Charlie was also concerned about collecting money while hosting breakfast.

Mark replied that he is still learning about setting up WPR Tours and that he personally intended to be at breakfast to collect the money as Tour Chair. The fee was applied to encourage members to show up once they register.

Mark also stated that a monthly newsletter is a challenge to get out considering his other responsibilities. He then invited anyone who wanted to take on producing the *Round-Up* to do so.

There was considerable discussion among the members present about charging a fee for the 2011 Progressive Dinner Tour. Some were in favor of keeping the fees and rebates, a policy the WPR Board had initiated at the beginning of the year, while others felt that the Progressive Dinner Tour should be underwritten by the Region.

President Eger then called for a Board vote as to whether or not the Region should underwrite the 2011 Progressive Dinner Tour. The Board voted 3 to 2 in favor of underwriting the tour. Mark Jackson said that since the *Round-Up* had not been mailed yet, he would change and reprint the flyer inserts to show that this tour is underwritten by the Region.

Four seater Thunderbirds would then fall into production auto classes according to year.

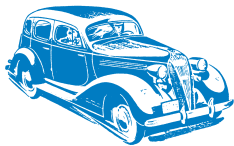

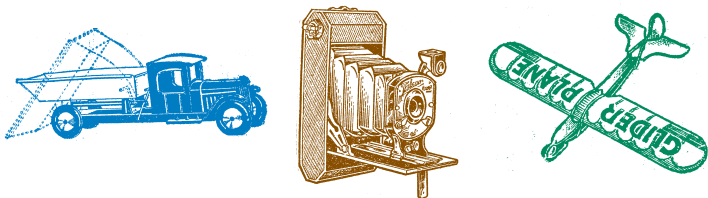
