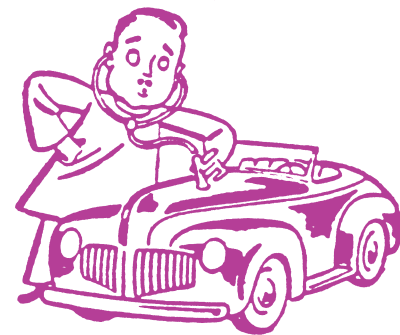

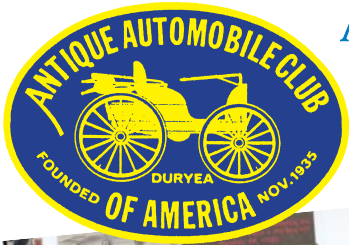

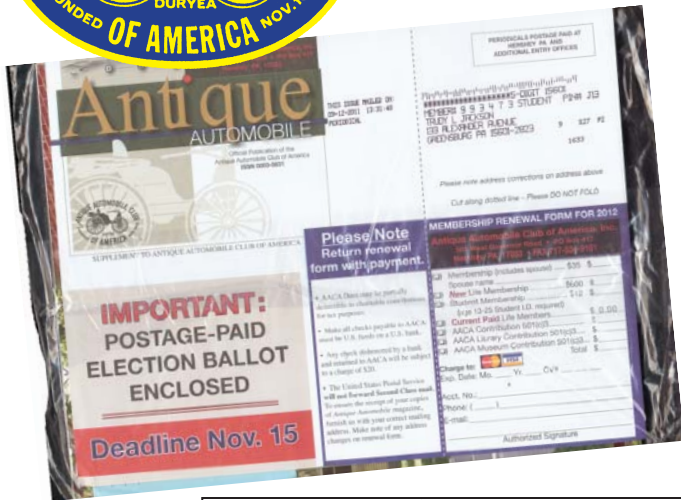

A meeting of the Western Pennsylvania Region of the Antique Automobile Club of America was held September 20, 2011 at the American Legion Post 982 Hall, Latrobe, PA, (Pipetown) commencing at approximately 7:30 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Vice President John Ross Kuhns followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

There were 48 members in attendance and two guests – Terry Bickerton and Rita Wall. Terry is the winner of the Region's 2011 Chance Car, a 1981 Camaro.

## Minutes of the August 16, 2011 Meeting

The minutes of the August 16, 2011 meeting were printed in the September *Western Round-Up*. Vice President Kuhns asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes. Hearing none, the Vice President called for a motion to approve the minutes.

Upon motion of Howard Finney, seconded by Mark DeFloria and unanimously carried, the minutes of the August 16, 2011 meeting were approved.

## Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Craig DeFloria prepared and submitted the August Treasurer's Report, but was not able to personally attend the August meeting to present it. Safety Director John Kuhns read the August Treasurer's report to the membership in Craig's absence, and asked for a motion to approve the report. A motion was made by Tom King, seconded by Ron Underwood. The August Treasurer's Report was unanimously approved.

John reported to the membership that due to school commitments, Craig DeFloria will not be able to attend the next few monthly meetings. However, he will provide an envelope/index card system for submitting reimbursements.

## OLD BUSINESS

### Membership - Howard Finney, Chairman

Howard Finney gave a membership reading for Terry Bickerton, who was recommended by Harvey Eger. A motion to accept Terry as a new member was made by Al Wirick, seconded by Tom King and unanimously approved.

Howard had applications from Tom and Linda Lang, but they were not present. Another new member applicant, Ron Horach plans to be at the October meeting.

### Tours - Mark Jackson, Chairman

Mark stated that the 2011 Progressive Dinner Tour held on Saturday, August 20th was an outstanding success and wonderful example of teamwork. It was a beautiful day for touring. Mark thanked all the dining stop hosts: Charlie and Connie Schifano, breakfast; Harvey and Susan Eger, salad; Mark and Jill Jackson and Pastor Elaine Frantz, Word of Life Ministries, dinner and John and Vicki Kuhns, dessert. Mark also thanked

all who attended. He encouraged members to volunteer to host a dining stop next year. It's great fun and really pulls the club together.

Mark said that he was looking into arranging an October tour to a local festival or car show, but found that most of them were being held during the same weekend as the big AACA Hershey event. He suggested that members consider "on your own" tours to an October 8th Antique Car Parade in downtown Bedford sponsored by the Fort Bedford Region AACA, and/or the Pumpkin Fest in Confluence, PA which also has a car show on October 9th. He asked Mark DeFloria to post links to more information and entry forms for these fall events on the Region's website.

Howard Finney said that he was planning a Pumpkin Run Tour for the Laurel Highlands Region on October 2nd and that Western members were welcome to participate. He asked anyone interested to contact him.

### Events - John Ross Kuhns, Chairman

Sally Wirick reported that the Western PA Region's Annual Christmas Party is planned for December 11th at DeNunzio's at Arnold Palmer Regional Airport, Latrobe. In order to keep member's costs down the Party will be partially subsidized by the Region. The menu will include steak and chicken. More information is to come.

### Car Show - Harvey Eger, Chairman

Carol Calabrace reported that this year's show had a total of 193 cars, 75 of which were pre registered. She thanked everyone involved for all their help. She also said that there were numerous compliments along with a few suggestions and complaints.

Tom Ulishiney thanked all who helped park cars.

Connie Schifano thanked all who donated baked goods for the Bake Sale. It was a wonderful day.

Charlie Schifano said that on a good note, Boy Scout Troop 405 was pleased with the income from their food booth. On a bad note, that he had received a complaint about someone touching a car as it was being parked.

John Kuhns conveyed thanks from Vicki and Blair Kuhns to all who donated items to the Chinese Auction, which raised approximately \$750.

Howard Finney reported that one of our judges sat in a car when judging. He reminded members that this is not permitted.

Howard then read aloud a letter criticizing the car show, which was received as an anonymous email. Essentially, the letter contained complaints related to judging criteria, Region

members entering their own cars, and suggestions regarding the possible addition of porta pottis and extending the sound system so that it can be heard in all areas of Legion Keener Park.

Chuck Speicher noted that the Region's Board of Directors discussed this letter at a recent meeting, has taken the comments under consideration and will take appropriate action.

Chuck then thanked all who worked and helped with the publicity aspects of the car show. He also informed members that there were follow up car show photos in the *Tribune-Review* after the show.

John Ross Kuhns commented that when Region members enter their vehicles in the car show they help fill out the classes and also help revenue.

Gary Cooper suggested the possibility of inviting judges from other regions to come and judge our show. He also said that no matter what you do there will be some complaints.

Howard Finney stated that a license plate is not a requirement to participate in the Region's car show.

Charlie Schifano suggested adding a "Show & Shine" class next year, which would not be defined by year or other criteria, and would not be judged. This class would offer car show participants the opportunity to park and show their cars near their friends cars no matter what year and make the cars were.

Mark Jackson thanked all who helped with the Kid's Corner. The sparkplug competition was a big hit. Most of the kids who tried it had never seen a sparkplug before.

Sally Findley said that about 35 - 40 Hot Wheels cars were sold and that the Kid's Corner was busy.

Both Sally and Mark agreed that it would be nice to have the Kid's Corner on the stage again next year.

## NEW BUSINESS

### 2012 Chance Car

Vice President Kuhns informed members that the Region is currently looking for a Chance Car for 2012. The preferred candidates are an antique Mustang, Camaro or Corvette, which the general public is very familiar with.

Safety Director John Kuhns commented that he has seen some outstanding Corvettes from the 80's going for very reasonable prices. He also stated that the 2011 Chance Car, a 1981 Camaro, had very little trunk space and usually needed a "chase car" to haul the Easy-Up canopy, etc. A hatchback Corvette would offer comparable trunk space and would be about as easy to get into and drive as the Camaro was.

Vice President Kuhns also informed members that the Board of Directors recently decided that the 2012 Chance Car winner would be chosen on the last weekend of October 2012, rather than the day before the car show on Labor Day weekend. This would allow the Region to sell Chance Car tickets during the Car Show and at other popular events through September and October. The goal is to sell all of the tickets. This year, despite a lot of hard work by many, we had approximately 540 unsold tickets. The later Chance Car date would also lighten the work load during the car show weekend and

allow us to focus more on the event. Another advantage will be that the Chance Car would have it's own exclusive place on the 2012 calendar.

The purchase budget for the 2012 Chance Car is around \$10,000.

### From the floor

Ron Barnhart informed members that there is no car cruise planned at Idlewild Park for Halloween this year.

John and John Ross Kuhns attended the Glenmore Gathering Auction and Show. High sale was a 1933 Marmon V-16, which did not run and sold for \$160,000.

Howard Finney reminded members that the Region's 2012 dues will be due starting in October and that Donna Surace has prepared a flyer which will be in the October *Western Round-Up*.

John Ross Kuhns informed members that a Halloween Dinner will be served prior to the October 18th meeting starting at 6:30 p.m. Members are encouraged to wear costumes. Cash prizes will be awarded for best costumes.

Mark DeFloria reminded members that Harvey Eger is a candidate for the AACA National Board of Directors. A voting card and other information are in the most recent issue of *Antique Automobile Magazine*. The voting card is included in the plastic wrap outside of the magazine along with an AACA National dues renewal form. Mark reminded all of Harvey's extensive participation in AACA judging and events, and conveyed that it would be a good thing for the Region to have a member on the AACA National Board. Harvey has served as the Western PA Region's President for the past six years.

### 50/50

Winner of the 50/50 was Joe Vrable who won \$66.00. The winner of the bonus was John Ross Kuhns who won \$65.00

Unclaimed prizes from the 2011 Car Show Chinese Auction were also raffled off.

### Adjournment

Vice President Kuhns asked for a motion to adjourn. A motion was made by Dick McKelvey, seconded by Ron Underwood and unanimously carried. The meeting was adjourned.

November, 1974 - I was a freshman at LaRoche College in the North Hills of Pittsburgh. My daily driver was a 1948 Chevrolet Stylemaster sedan, which had just become an antique the year before. It was the oldest car on campus.

Purchased from the original owner, a 93 year-old man from Bovard, PA, the car's original radio worked like a charm. I doubt that he listened to it very much.

So from my personal collection of "stuff from college you just can't throw away", here is a pocket-sized "music sheet" from Pittsburgh's now long gone 13Q radio station, which was broadcast on glorious AM. Do you remember any of these hits songs from the Sensational 70's? I can still see the soft orange glow of my Stylemaster's radio dial as the speaker blasted, "Everybody was Kung Foo fighting....those cats were fast as lightning..."

Check out the graphics on the cover – trolley, Civic Arena, an analog phone! 13Q used to have a "dial-in-to-win contest" between song sets. The D-Jay would announce, "Be the 7th caller and win \$75 in the 13Q Snatch!" This would be a feat I would accomplish several times from my college apartment to the amazement of my roommates. And that prize money – it bought some new retreads for the '48 Stylemaster of course!

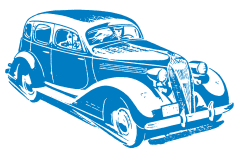
