

Mike's Musings

his month let's take a look at the development and early history of one of the most iconic cars on American history. The first Thunderbirds arrived on showroom floors for the 1955 model year, but the history of the car goes back even further than that. The idea goes back into the mid 1940's. Our soldiers in Europe saw much smaller, better handling cars on the roads over there. Many of them were short wheelbase open roadsters. While they tended to have small engines, they were light and easy to whip around European roads. When these soldiers came home, many of them began to look for just this type of American car. Then, in 1953 Chevrolet introduced the Corvette, which very closely resembled those smaller European cars. While Ford had been considering a smaller two seater for some time, they realized they needed to move quickly in order to keep up with their arch rival. So the idea for the T-Bird was born. One of the best ideas they had was to offer the 'Bird with standard V-8 power. Chevrolet had received many complaints concerning their under-powered Corvettes. In many drivers' minds the "Blue Flame" six just wasn't enough engine for "spirited" driving. To avoid that issue, Ford decided to offer the 292 cubic inch V-8 as standard equipment. The rest of the car was equally well designed. It had the longer/shorter deck proportions reminiscent of many of those European sports cars.

An interesting story here involves the naming of the car. Ford executives ran a contest among employees looking for the best name. The prize for winning was a new suit (comical by today's standards). The cars were an immediate hit. Many folks fell in love with the design, and they sold well. A little known fact here is that they sold so well that the nice folks at Chevrolet considered pulling the plug on the Corvette, seeing how poorly they were selling compared to the Thunderbirds. As

well-received as the T-Birds were, they suffered from an immediate problem. Two seaters were inherently unpractical. They were fine for single folks, but few were sold to families. Ford saw the writing on the wall and in 1958 changed the 'Bird forever by turning it into a four passenger "Personal Luxury" car. Many people mourned the loss of the true sports car, but the Ford marketing folks knew their business and sales jumped for that year. Engine sizes also increased in 1958. The new engine was a 352 cubic inch V-8, putting out 300 horsepower. Body styles ran in three year cycles for the Thunderbirds, so the "Square Birds" would last from 1958 to 1960.

The "Bullet Birds" would come in 1961 and last through 1963. In keeping with the times, Ford designers would add many new jet age touches like afterburner style tail lights and toggle switch style switches. The base engine increased to 390 cubic inches. The horsepower rating stayed at 300, but the torque rose dramatically to 427 pound feet.

The "Flair Birds" would appear in 1964 and be around until 1966. Styling was toned down significantly for these models. The base engine would remain the 390, but a new 345 horsepower 428 V-8 would be offered as an option in '66. Sales of the car would continue off and on up into the 2000 model year, before being completely discontinued.

et ready. The Western PA Region's 2013 Chance Car is an outstanding 1965 Mustang with an automatic transmission powered by a 289 V-8. It is an exciting burgundy-bronze color with a beautiful black Pony interior. The car was originally from California and purchased from an owner in Michigan. According to WPR Treasurer John Ross Kuhns, "It's one of the nicest chance cars we've ever had."

The Western PA Region Board of Directors voted to raise the selling price of the 2013 Chance Car tickets from \$5 to \$10 per ticket. Only 5,000 tickets will be printed with two numbers per ticket. The winning number will be determined by the four digit PA Lottery number drawn on October 26, 2013. If the winning ticket is not sold, tickets will play each following day until a winner is determined. The winner must claim the car within 30 days of winning date or forfeit. The winner is responsible for taxes and title transfer.

The Region has been selling Chance Car tickets with two numbers each @ \$5. for approximately 30 years. In order to keep up with inflation and rising costs the Board decided it was time to increase the price of the tickets. The increase to \$10. is based on good raffle ticket management principles. It is best to sell tickets that are priced according to the increments our money is printed in. A price between \$5 and \$10. is difficult to make change for, and complicates accounting. Also, intuitively, people are less prone to break a \$10 bill, rather than to part with it. Considering a 2.85% inflation rate, a \$5. raffle ticket sold in 1987 would sell for \$10.39 today. (source:Dollar Times inflation calculator, www.dollartimes.com)



The Board hopes that the ticket price increase will serve the Region and it's mission well for many years to come.
