

he Western PA Region AACA celebrated the 50th Anniversary Paul P. Bell Memorial Antique Auto, Custom and Street Rod Show in style at Legion Keener Park, Latrobe on Sunday, September 1, 2013. Early in the morning, everything was ready to go. Then a few dark clouds moved in with a morning shower. There were already cars on the show field as the showers began. Vehicles continued to trickle in during the rain. As the raindrops ceased, the show field traffic momentum began to build until a handsome display of classy and unusual vehicles took shape. By late morning there was a nice crowd of people roaming the grounds and a very nice car show was underway.

Under the main pavilion the Chinese Auction, Bake Sale and Chance Car ticket sales were going full tilt. 50/50 ticket sales took place throughout the show field during the course of the day. 

Minutes of the August 20, 2013 Monthly Meeting

There were 54 members in attendance and one guest, Rich Marker.

Minutes of the July 16, 2013 monthly meeting were printed in the August, 2013 *Western Round-Up*. President DeFloria asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes. Mark DeFloria motioned to approve the minutes as printed, seconded by Gary Wiegand and unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report

John Ross Kuhns read the Treasurer's Report. President DeFloria asked if there were any additions or corrections. Tom King made a motion to approve the report as presented, seconded by Ron Underwood and unanimously approved.

OLD BUSINESS

Membership - Howard Finney

Howard reported that Rich Marker is filling out an application.

Dues - Donna Surace

Donna asked members to continue encouraging people to join. Invite them to attend a meeting. There is membership information in the Chance Car. We need to introduce the next generation to the hobby. A membership renewal form will go out in the September newsletter. Renewals are due by January. The membership renewal form needs filled out even if you have earned a free membership from Chance Car ticket sales.

NEW BUSINESS

2013 Chance Car - Donna Surace

Donna told members that they are doing a great job selling tickets. After tonight please turn in only stubs and money.

Car Show ticket sales will be credited to the WPR as are the ticket sales from the Antique Automobile Magazine ad.

At this point, 65.66% of the total goal monies have been turned in. The ticket price increase this year has yielded a better return for the effort. 57% of WPR member families have helped sell tickets this year. Reward vouchers will be issued in November. The first 40 tickets sold are applied to a free WPR membership renewal.

President DeFloria asked member to see Donna if they need more tickets to sell.

Chuck Speicher informed those present of open September

dates. Chuck will be away for two weeks. Please see Donna to Schedule the Chance Car while he is away.

Car Show - Tom Ulishney

Sponsors, Awards & Registration - Carol Calabrace noted that, as of now, we have 31 award sponsors. Trophies and dash plaques will be ready next week. There are currently 55 preregistered vehicles, 17 of which are AACA Seniors.

Storage Trailer - Tom reported that he, Dave Sheetz and Craig DeFloria got into the WPR storage trailer and cleared out a lot of stuff. There are some old blue t-shirts from the swap meet and ID lanyards from the Founders Tour, which are available if anyone wants them.

Entrance & Registration - Clay Stoner and Dick McKelvey will be at the gate entrance to the Car Show and hand out candy to drivers as they enter. Tom King and Ralph Shearer will be further on down to collect entrance fees. Barbara Erny and Mary Ann Brant will handle preregistered entries. Each car will receive a souvenir 50th Anniversary Car Show note pad while supplies last. (250 printed)

Door Prizes - Dodie will take car of the door prizes.

Bake Sale - Connie Schifano asked for members to bring baked goods to the show. A sign up sheet is being passed around. If you cannot bring your donation to the show please call and arrangements will be made to pick it up.

Chinese Auction - Vickie and Blair Kuhns are working on the Chinese Auction. It is o.k. to bring items the day of the show, but it is easier if they are received ahead of time.

Fire extinguishers will sell for \$20. each, same as last year.

50/50 Drawing - Debbie Sheetz will help with the 50/50. All of the tickets should be the same color.

Vendors - Jill Jackson reported that the food vendors will be Boy Scout Troop 405 with hamburgers, hot dogs and ham barbecues, Battaglia's Catering and Gee's Ice Cream Truck.

John Kuhns, Sr. reported that a Restoration Shop will be displaying four cars in a roped off area of the parking log across from the food vendors. They will pay a fee for the space.

Set Up - Dave Sheetz will be working with other WPR volunteers to set up the Show Field Saturday, August 31st. If you are helping park cars at the Show on Sunday, helping layout the Show Field on Saturday will help orient you as to where the various car classes go.

Set up for the Car Show starts at 7:00 a.m.

Signs - Ralph Shearer will put signs along the Latrobe streets coming into Legion Keener Park. Al Wirick will put a couple of signs along Route 30 leading to Latrobe.

Promotions - Chuck Speicher reported that ads will run on Comcast Channel 8. An ad will also run on the electronic board by the Arnold Palmer Regional Airport along Route 30. (traffic count is 40-45K cars per day.) There is also going to be a photo op with the *Latrobe Bulletin* and the Chance Car. Chuck asked members present if they had any other connections with local newspapers to help promote the show. He noted that the Rotary would not accept the WPR Car Show listing for their electronic Community Board in downtown Greensburg.

Kids' Corner - We will need some help in the Kids' Corner this year.

Judging - Howard Finney asked members to please sign up to help with the judging. We need two judges for each class. Judging will begin at 1:00 p.m.

Flag Ceremony - Boy Scouts from Troop 405 will conduct a posting of the colors as a flag ceremony at around 3:45 p.m. prior to the WPR giving out this year's Car Show awards. They will have a drummer to help draw attention to the ceremony. DJ Pete Highlands will play the Star Spangled Banner when the colors are posted. President DeFloria will then announce the winners.

Car Show worker food - Nancy Wolfe needs some help serving food to Car Show workers. Dominic Surace asked that we also add some kielbasa in addition to the hot dogs.

Parking - We want all cars to park on the Show Field in their appropriate classes. No for sale signs permitted on the Show Field.

Tom noted that we are not going to do a "People's Choice Award" this year. There will be a Kids' Choice Trophy.

John noted that this year's attendance was down a little bit.

Just Thinking Again...

hese articles make me feel old. In 1938, my Uncle Arthur, who lived next door, sold out. He then moved to Portland, Oregon with his 1938 Chevy and a trailer, which was made out of a Model A Ford pickup bed and loaded six feet above the bed.



A short time later my dad and mom sold out and bought an old farm house and barn on the left side of the road before you get to King's Nursery just east of Greensburg. At that time, it was just David King's family home. The little old house is still there nestled in the large pines. Dave Sr., started the nursery business in the basement of the old house. He started all the different evergreens in small pots filled with sand. After Mr. King said they had roots, Raymond would get

the old John Deer (it was new then) and plow up an acre or so. Then Raymond King, Raymond Hemminger and myself would plant for days and days. Note - Raymond Hemminger retired from King's Nursery after working there for 61 years and has since passed away.

As the business grew a greenhouse was added and then a larger two story building with all kinds of gardening equipment on the first floor. The second floor was full of model trains - Lionel and American Flyer. I gave my Lionel to my grand kids and still have the Flier.

After Raymond King died the business went down hill fast and all that remains is a small office with a small amount of supplies. I miss the good old days, but life goes on.

Out & About Riding the Historic Red Buses at Glacier National Park, Montana

WPR members Roger and Jan Christiansen got a chance to ride in these historic Red Jammer buses at Glacier National Park in Montana this summer. Roger said that it is called "prairie dogging" when the bus stops and the tourists all stand to pop their heads out of the bus's open top in order to get a better look at the spectacular scenery and vistas.

While the buses are called reds, the bus drivers are called jammers because of the sound the gears made when shifting on the steep roads of the park. The "jamming" sound came from the unsynchronised transmissions, where double-clutching was a must.

Originally tested at Yosemite National Park in California in 1935, they were manufactured as the Model 706 by the White Motor

Company from 1936-1939. The distinctive vehicles, with roll-back canvas convertible tops, were the product of noted industrial designer Alexis de Sakhnoffsky, and originally operated in seven National Parks. Glacier National Park still operates 33 of their original buses today.

Glacier's were restored from 2000-2002 by Ford Motor Company in conjunction with TransGlobal in Livonia Michigan to run on propane or gas to lessen their environmental impact.[1] The bodies were removed from their original chassis and built upon modern Ford E-Series van chassis.[2] The original standard transmissions were also replaced in 1989 with newer automatics, removing the trademark "jamming" sound.
