

One day we ventured out to Luray Caverns. This is a very popular tourist destination, and I must say that if you've never been there it is certainly worth the trip. The caverns feature some of the most beautiful and dramatic formations in the world. They are well lighted and easy to walk through. Adjoining the entrance to the caverns there is also a Toy Museum and a Transportation Museum. We enjoyed both, but the Transportation Museum in particular was calling my name. It displayed a wonderful progression of vehicles starting with horse drawn coaches and sleds to early brass era automobiles and outstanding cars of the late 1930's and early 1940's. Regis and I photographed many interesting cars which I will share in future issues of the *Western Round-Up* and on the website

I am one of those guys who spends a lot of time reading museum display cards, so my family has learned to patiently go on ahead of me knowing that I will be along.

The 1941 Lincoln limousine pictured above once belonged to Edsel Ford, another automotive hero of mine. When the Model T had passed its prime it was Edsel who paved the way for the Model A. He also had a lot to do with innovative styling and engineering. 




# The 1931 Willys Runs Again

his is a continuance from "Getting into the hobby part one". The Willys set in Kay's garage with a broken axle over the winter of '63 until spring of 1964. Finally in Hemmings Motor News I found a man advertising parts for a 1931 Willys. Kay called, and soon had the axle. He had the car towed to Russ Mc-Combs' alley garage. Russ was an instructor at what is now known as Wyo Tech in Blairsville, and an alley mechanic in the evening. With the axle in, Russ got it ready to drive, and found that over the winter the block had cracked. Kay gave up and was going to sell it for junk. I bought it and towed it home. At a Punxsutawney Region meeting I learned that a shop in New Bethlehem was able to weld cracked blocks. So Russ came to my place and we removed the engine. We loaded it in my neighbor's Chevy pick up and took it to the shop. We got it back and Russ came to my garage and installed it. The engine started right up, but the weld didn't hold. At a meeting of the Region I was talking about the car, and that I hoped to find an engine. A member asked me if I wanted to sell it. I knew what I had invested, gave him the figure, and he bought it. He towed it home to DuBois. As a shade tree mechanic, he removed the engine and dropped a 1950 Plymouth motor in. He then painted the car and drove it for many years.

Kay liked my Ford coupe and decided to fine one. In my Hemmings Motor News he located one in Corry, PA. With the help of a friend he towed it home behind his new Plymouth wagon. It was mostly original and ran OK. He stored it over the winter (Prestone in the

radiator), and was getting it ready to drive in the spring. Note: The not original battery box had been welded to the left engine firewall. Being no mechanical genius, he was pouring gasoline into the tank from a metal can which came in contact with something - FIRE. He was burned and spent several weeks in the hospital. Came out OK. Lost interest in old cars, and sold it to his friend who helped tow it home. His friend then had it put back to original and gave it to his daughter. She passed her driver's exam in it, much to the amazement of the State Cop. She graduated from Indiana University of PA, got married and took it to their new home in Ohio. End of story.
