Fred Nicholls Inducted into AACA Judges Honor Society

Western PA Region member Fred Nichols began judging at Antique Automobile Club of America (AACA) Meets and Shows, as he puts it, “from the ground up.” During his first judging stint at the Hershey Meet in 1966 Fred found himself assigned as a chassis judge. This involved reviewing vehicles on his hands and knees and crawling under them to check out chassis details. “They asked us to keep an eye out for electric fuel pumps,” recalled Fred. From that time forward, Fred found himself serving as an AACA Judge in a variety of capacities including team captain. He has also judged under some interesting conditions. One of the most challenging was a Meet in Pennsylvania’s Pocono Mountains when the heat reached 100 degrees.

In October 2014, Fred Nicholls was inducted into the AACA Judges Honor Society for his outstanding service as an AACA Judge over the years. Western PA Region Membership Chairman and fellow AACA Judge Howard Finney presented a certificate and pin to Fred on behalf

of AACA Judges Honor Society Chairman John Myers at Fred’s home in Indiana, PA. Western PA Region President Mark Jackson was also present. Fred proudly wore a special AACA Judges Honor Society shirt for the occasion, which he had received earlier from the National Office in Hershey.

The National Judges Honor Society certificate presented to Fred read as follows: “The Antique Automobile Club of America is proud to recognize Fred Nicholls as a member of the AACA Judges Honor Society. Your outstanding investment of knowledge, time and dedication to the AACA Judging Program provides tangible and significant contributions to AACA and signifies your devotion to duty and dedication to the preservation of antique automobiles.”

According to AACA National records, Fred has served as an AACA Judge at 38 Meets earning 120 judging credits through the years. The last AACA Meet he judged at was the 2005 Eastern Spring Meet, which was held at the University of Pittsburgh, Greensburg Campus.

Fred and his wife Ann are long time members of both the Western PA and Punxsutawney Regions. He ran a funeral home in Indiana, PA for 55 years.

During his lifetime Fred has owned 40 different antique cars (not all at once). Two of his favorites were a 1957 Ford Thunderbird and a 1948 Lincoln Continental. He

From the Floor

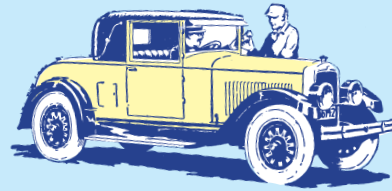
Cris Detwiler announced that he was invited to participate in the Concours d'Elegance. Congratulations Cris!

From Your Board of Directors...

Proposed By-Laws Amendments

The Western PA Region AACA Directors met on September 24, 2014 and after careful consideration propose the following amendments to the Region's By-Laws. Please review these items as members will be asked to vote on each of them at the Annual Meeting on January 11, 2015.

1.) Addition under Article VII – Directors and Officers

Purpose: To allow the Board to make adjustments should a Director become unable or unwilling to serve so that the Board can continue to function fully and effectively.

Should a director miss more than three directors meetings during a calendar year, the other directors may vote to remove that director from the board. The remaining directors may then vote to appoint a replacement for the removed director from the general membership to finish that director's term. The appointed replacement director would fill the same office as the removed director with the exception of the president.

2.) Addition under Article IV – Members

Purpose: To formally establish Western Pennsylvania Region AACA memberships for young people. (Patterned after AACA National membership definitions.)

Student Member – Student Members are individuals ages 13-25 years old. A Student Member of the Western PA Region must first be a Student Member of

the Antique Automobile Club of America. A Student Member must follow the same application procedures as Regular Member. Student Members have full membership privileges.

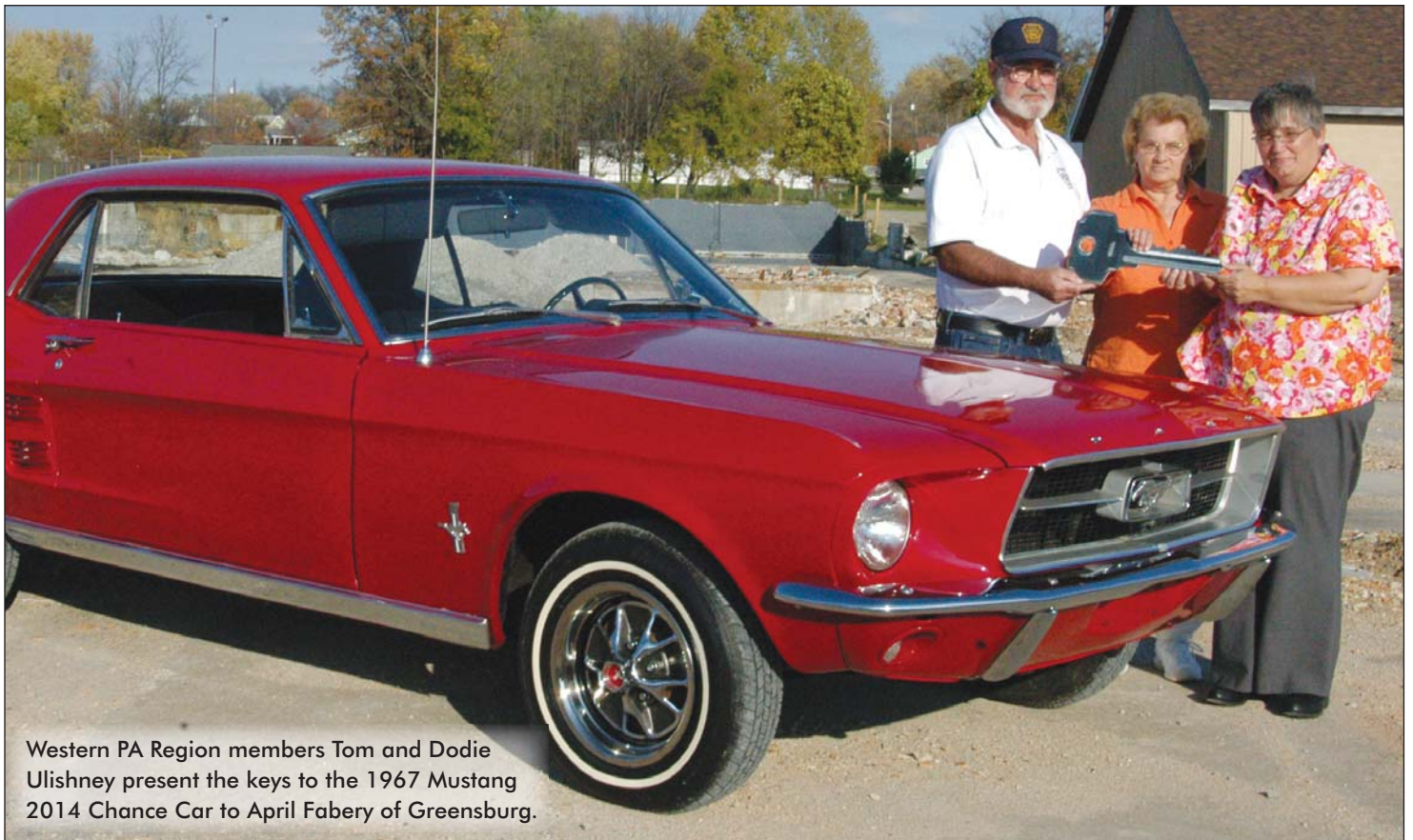
Junior Member – Junior Members are individuals ages 0-12 years old. A Junior Member of the Western PA Region must first be a Junior Member of the Antique Automobile Club of America. No reading procedure and vote is required for a Junior Member. Junior members do not have to have parents who are members of either the Western PA Region or AACA. Junior Members have no voting rights.

3.) Addition under Article VIII – Duties

Purpose: To define the duties of the Publicity and Safety Directors positions

The Publicity Director shall help coordinate promotional efforts for the Region regarding events, programs and membership. This also includes contact with print, electronic and social media to seek out opportunities to maintain and promote a positive image for the Western Pennsylvania Region and its mission.

The Safety Director shall help assure that safety procedures are followed during all Region tours, events and programs, which includes making special arrangements as necessary.

Remembering Joe Amadio

This past September an obituary for Joseph Amadio was in the Greensburg *Tribune Review*. Unless you were a member of “The Greatest Generation” by Tom Brokaw and had never lived in Jeannette you passed it by.

Joe was a friend of mine. A veteran of WWII, he came home to Jeannette, and eventually opened a Used Car lot on Route 30, right across from where the main road from Jeannette (Lowry Ave.) met Route 30. It was a small lot with maybe 10 or so cars, but really nice ones.

One day I stopped to look around, Joe said, “I want you to see my new car”, and we went behind the office to a small garage. He opened the door and there sat the biggest Packard I had ever seen. It was a ‘37 or ‘38 V-12 convertible sedan with dual sidemounts, white sidewall tires, black paint and a tan fabric top. This started his love for Packard cars and he always had several. Next was a 1948 Custom Eight convertible, painted a cream color, but what made it different was a windshield attached to the back of the front seat. Joe married one of the best looking girls in Jeannette and they drove it on their honeymoon.

In the fifties he moved the lot West on Route 30, about where Gene’s Musical Bar once stood, and had a bigger showroom. He then had Packard Caribbean convertibles and hardtop coupes.

Once when I stopped, he had a perfect 1947 Clipper sedan, which he tried to sell me, but too new for an antique plate at the time.

I bought three cars from Joe. A 1954 Cadillac Coupe, which Ann and I drove on our honeymoon, and two “beater” cars. One was a 1954 DeSoto sedan, which needed rocker panels. Got the panels and had a back alley garage install them for \$10. I primed and painted them myself. The car ran so good, that we would drive it to the Mall in Pittsburgh.

The last I talked to Joe, the lot was back east of the intersection, and his son was running it. It wasn’t the type of lot he first had, but many years had passed us by.



Just Thinking Again!

Way back, my Uncle Bert Kuhns owned the farm that now belongs to the Schmezies on the corner of the road below the Luxor substation that goes to the lower lake dam breast at Twin Lakes Park. My dad and his brother each bought an acre of ground at the upper end of this farm. They each built nearly identical homes there. This was in about 1934. I can still remember my mom and dad digging and scooping the dirt out of the foundation with a Model A Ford Pick Up and an old scoop that was supposed to be pulled by a team of horses. Then they picked and dug out the corners by hand to square them up.

Before then, we lived in “Crows Nest”, now called “Bovard”. When we live there my dad would tease me and say that I was hatched by a crow.

The Model A Pick Up was our only transportation. So when my sister came along we needed more seating capacity. At the time, my grandpa was service manager at the Buick Garage on Maple Avenue in Greensburg. It was located beside the store on the corner of Maple Avenue and Third Street. It was a three story building, new and used cars on

the first floor, parts and service on the second and body shop on the third.

Dad bought a 1929 Dodge four door sedan. After a short time, he decided it was too expensive to run. (Gas had gone up to 10 cents a gallon!) He then got a Model A Ford two door sedan and kept it quite a few years.

In 1939, Grandpa called and told dad that his garage just got in a 1937 Chevy that was a city taxi, but was well taken care of, and could be had for a good price. (We had a phone because my dad worked for the W.P.A.) We went, looked it over, took a drive, made a deal and then drove it home. Dad drove that car until 1949. At that time, I was service manager at Central Motor (Ford on Weldon St., Latrobe) There he bought a sea mist green Ford Custom. Dad and mom gave me the car after neither wanted to drive anymore. Later, Clay Stoner got it and it stayed around for a few more years. Where is it now? I don’t know. How about you Clay?

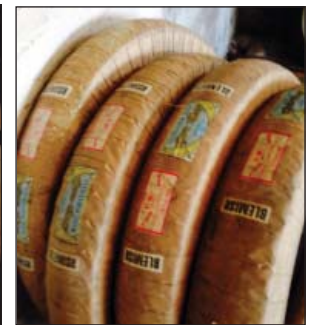
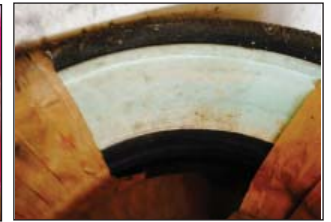

Name That Car

October's Car



Unfortunately, no one correctly guessed October's Car. Many tried, but no one seemed to notice the "H" logo in the top center of the radiator cover. What does that "H" stand for?
