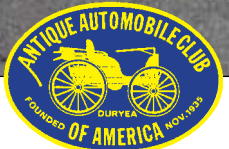

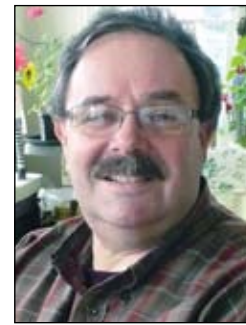

To me there is something poetic about a parade of antique cars. It's kind of like "the march of time." Speaking of which, we are nearing the end of another great year. Although it was a bit wet, I hope everyone had fun.

Cash award to a student currently enrolled in an institution of higher learning leading up to a degree in antique automotive technology and or restoration.

YOUNG PEOPLE'S AWARD

A cash award to AACA member, child or grandchild of an active AACA member in good standing for at least five years, who has been accepted into an accredited

institution of higher learning or is now enrolled in such institution, i.e., a four-year college leading to a bachelor's degree or a two-year vocational education program leading to a degree. Applicant must be nominated by a Region or Chapter of AACA and must be no more than 25 years old.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

A cash award to an AACA member, child or grandchild of an active AACA member in good standing for at least five years, who has been accepted into an accredited institution of higher learning or is now enrolled in such institution, i.e., a four-year college leading to a bachelor's degree or a two-year vocational education program leading to a diploma. Applicant must be no more than 25 years old.

**Please note that one award is for an individual enrolled in an Antique Auto Major and can be of any age. The remaining scholarships are for individuals, no more than 25 years old and enrolled in any curriculum that leads to a degree.*

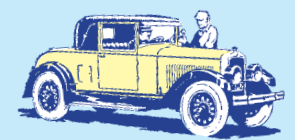
flyers on the popular cruise, which has been attended by many WPR members in the past.

There is not enough room in the pages of *The Western Round-Up* to do photographic justice to the amazing variety of things members saw during the Pumpkin Run Tour which took place on Saturday, October 18th. Cris and Molly Detwiler working with Ron and Alice Shaulis pulled together an extraordinary afternoon.

Starting at the Latrobe K-Mart on Route 30 around 1:00 p.m., the group of about 34 members traveled east through the Ligonier Gorge towards Somerset County. The clouds were a little dreary, but the fall leaves were at their colorful peak and the views were splendid. Cris and Molly made the drive extra fun by compiling a list of observation trivia questions and riddles. Participants could figure out most of the answers if they paid attention to specific items along the tour route.

The tour left Route 30 at Ligonier and followed Route 711 to Route 31 East to Donegal. Turning right at Sarnelli's Market the group continued a short distance on Route 381 and stopped at Pletcher's Farm Market near Champion. There members could marvel at a giant 1,124 pound pumpkin and choose much more manageable ones to take home with them. From Your Board of Directors...

Proposed By-Laws Amendments

The Western PA Region AACA Directors met on September 24, 2014 and after careful consideration propose the following amendments to the Region's By-Laws. Please review these items as members will be asked to vote on each of them at the Annual Meeting on January 11, 2015.

1.) Addition under Article VII – Directors and Officers

Purpose: To allow the Board to make adjustments should a Director become unable or unwilling to serve so that the Board can continue to function fully and effectively.

Should a director miss more than three directors meetings during a calendar year, the other directors may vote to remove that director from the board. The remaining directors may then vote to appoint a replacement for the removed director from the general membership to finish that director's term. The appointed replacement director would fill the same office as the removed director with the exception of the president.

2.) Addition under Article IV – Members

Purpose: To formally establish Western Pennsylvania Region AACA memberships for young people. (Patterned after AACA National membership definitions.)

Student Member – Student Members are individuals ages 13-25 years old. A Student Member of the Western PA Region must first be a Student Member of

the Antique Automobile Club of America. A Student Member must follow the same application procedures as Regular Member. Student Members have full membership privileges.

Junior Member – Junior Members are individuals ages 0-12 years old. A Junior Member of the Western PA Region must first be a Junior Member of the Antique Automobile Club of America. No reading procedure and vote is required for a Junior Member. Junior members do not have to have parents who are members of either the Western PA Region or AACA. Junior Members have no voting rights.

3.) Addition under Article VIII – Duties

Purpose: To define the duties of the Publicity and Safety Directors positions

The Publicity Director shall help coordinate promotional efforts for the Region regarding events, programs and membership. This also includes contact with print, electronic and social media to seek out opportunities to maintain and promote a positive image for the Western Pennsylvania Region and its mission.

The Safety Director shall help assure that safety procedures are followed during all Region tours, events and programs, which includes making special arrangements as necessary.

Policies and Procedures Manual Development

At their September 24, 2014 meeting the Western Pennsylvania Region AACA Board of Directors also approved the development of a Western Pennsylvania Region AACA Policies and Procedures Manual. This manual will cover a broad variety of topics and serve as a handy "how to" and reference guide for the future.

Development of this Manual will be a long term project which will need the valuable input of many Western Pennsylvania Region members who currently serve, or have served, in coordinating a variety of Region, activities, tours, events and conducting the Region's business.

Topics will include the many facets of: coordinating the car show; hosting and conducting different kinds of tours;

hosting and coordinating various Region events and meetings; managing the Chance Car; coordinating and producing the Western Round-Up newsletter and managing the Region's website, Awards criteria, etc.

Mark Jackson and Mark DeFloria have agreed to coordinate development of this manual and will start by pulling an outline together. They welcome input from Region members. Watch for the Western Round-Up and Region website for the announcement of input sessions and opportunities to offer input.

In the end, the Manual will be a "living document" subject to appropriate updates and revisions. It will be available electronically and in print.

The radio speaker in the center curls over the middle like a plastic waterfall. Once upon a time in the late 1940's, if the driver and passenger were listening to Western Swing entertainer Tex Williams sing, "Smoke, Smoke, Smoke" on that radio, they could conveniently snuff out their cigarette butts in the dual ash trays on top of the dash.
