## *From Your President*

The warm summer evenings are approaching. Thinking back, my sister Elaine and I loved going to the drive-in movies when we were kids growing up in the 60's. We lived in the West Point plan near Greensburg, so the drive-in our family most frequented was the Rustic in Norvelt, which is now long gone. We would check the *Tribune Review* to see what was playing. Often we would go to see the new Jerry Lewis comedy, and after the movie the whole way home my mother would say, "Why do we always have to go see Jerry Lewis? I just don't think he's funny." Meanwhile my dad chuckled quietly to himself as he drove. (I never saw my dad laugh so loud at a movie than when Jerry tangled with a high pressure fire hose in his comedy *Rock-A-Bye Baby*.)

Our best drive-in car was a 1963 Chevy Nova station wagon. Elaine and I could see very well out of it and we could fold down the back seat, stretch out and fall asleep during the second feature, which mom and dad could enjoy in quiet. I remember one of those second features being *Texas Across the River* with Dean Martin and Joey Bishop. I tried to stay awake to watch it, but quickly faded away.

During the 70's and teenage years I remember sitting on the hood of a 1967 Rambler Rebel with my buddies watching *Jason and the Argonauts* at the Hi-Way Drive-In in Latrobe. I also remember sitting on the fat fenders of my 1948 Chevy at a Somerset drive-in watching the John Wayne movie *Brannigan* during a night off from working on Staff at the Boy Scouts Camp Conestoga near Bakersville.

After Jill and I married and had our two girls, we thought it was time to take them to the drive-in movies. We went to a drive-in at North Versailles on Route 30 to see Disney's *Angels in the Outfield*. It had been years since either of us had gone to a drive-in movie. We had a 1987 Ford Taurus station wagon at the time and thought we were all set. We were shocked to discover that the drive-in was now full of minivans, which surrounded us and were much taller than our Taurus. We couldn't see the screen sitting in our car, so we put blankets on the roof and sat our little girls on top of the car standing beside them the entire movie. We were disgruntled and that was our last drive-in experience.

I think the Evergreen Drive-In still operates in Mount Pleasant. After all these years, perhaps it's time for Jill and I to try drive-ins again.

# Exciting Developments at the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force

**Editors Note:** In his regular column in the May/June 2015 issue of *Antique Automobile Magazine*, AACA Executive Director Steve Moskowitz mentions a side trip he recently took to the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force in Dayton, Ohio. According to Steve, "the museum is a destination that you need to put on your bucket list if you are even a mild fan of airplanes."

WPR member and B-52 crew veteran Al Friend is putting together a visit to this fabulous museum as a joint tour with the Corvair Club. The tour is being planned for fall of 2016. Although an earlier attempt to visit the museum in 2013 was unexpectedly halted by a federal government shutdown over a budget impasse, a return trip in 2016 may offer an opportunity to enjoy some very exciting enhancements and new exhibitions at this amazing museum. According to Al, plans are to return to the excellent Hope Hotel which is very close to the museum.

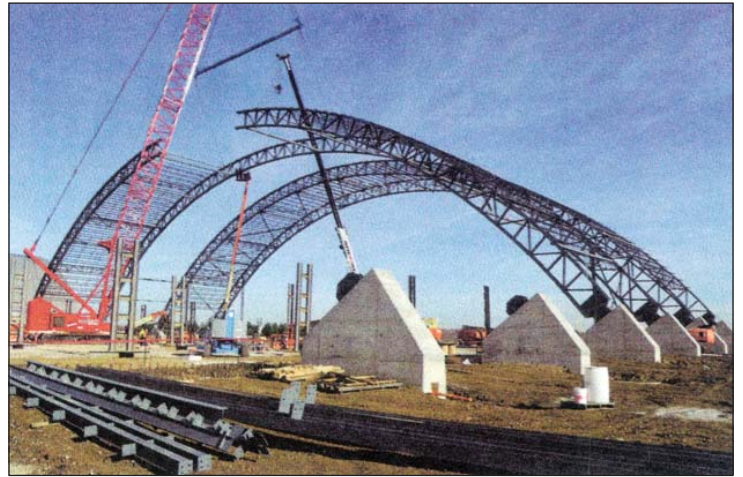

The National Museum of the U.S. Air Force's Missile and Space Gallery will be closed temporarily in early May (2015), for construction linking the gallery to the Museum's new building, which is scheduled to open to the public in the spring of 2016.

Plans for the fourth building project design call for the Missile and Space Gallery's exterior wall panels to be removed on the south side to form new entrances on the first floor and mezzanine levels. Once completed, the

new 224,000 square foot fourth building will offer the public both ground and upper level views of all the new galleries (Presidential Aircraft, Research and Development, Space and Global Reach).

Artifacts and exhibits listed at [www.nationalmuseum.af.mil/exhibits/missile/index.asp](http://www.nationalmuseum.af.mil/exhibits/missile/index.asp) will not be accessible while the gallery is closed, except for the Apollo 15 Command Module, Dyna-Soar x-20A, Aerojet Aerobee Rocket, and the Gen. T.D. White and "Five Stars in Space" exhibits. Although the public will not have direct access to most of the artifacts in the Missile and Space Gallery during the closure, a video featuring those exhibits will be available for viewing at the gallery entrance.

The public is also encouraged to explore the gallery online by visiting the Museum's virtual tour at [www.nmusavirtualtour.com](http://www.nmusavirtualtour.com). The virtual tour allows visitors to take a virtual, 3D self-guided tour of the entire Museum. Visitors can navigate from gallery to gallery either by using a drop-down map or by following navigational arrows connecting the individual nodes. Icons indicate hotspots where the visitor can get additional information such as videos, audio and links to online resources.

According to Museum Director Lt Gen (Ret) Jack Hudson, although the closure of the Missile and Space Gallery creates a short-term inconvenience, the long-term benefits are well worth the wait.

"The fourth building will bring many advantages including the relocation of the popular Presidential and R&D Gallery aircraft from a controlled-access portion of Wright-Patterson Air Force Base to the main Museum campus where they will be accessible to all visitors, along with the Global Reach Gallery and an expanded Space

every day of the Festival. Visitors really enjoy seeing the cars, and there are WPR members near the cars selling Chance Car tickets all day, every day during the Festival.

The Festival opens at 10:00 a.m. and closes at 8:00 p.m. You can come and go as best suits your schedule. All time slots for selling Chance Car tickets are now full.

**Please Note:** If your car is for sale you are permitted to place a flyer on the driver's seat, but please do not stick a sign in your windows.

Gallery," said Hudson. "In addition, we will be able to display some artifacts that had previously been kept in storage, such as the Titan IV launch vehicle, or kept outside, such as the C-141 Hanoi Taxi and the C-130E."

Construction of the fourth building continues to progress. Utility lines have been installed, and the steel trusses are being erected. During the winter months, metal siding will be added along with the roof. The building is expected to be completed in late summer 2015, and the Museum will then begin populating it that fall with aircraft. A public opening is anticipated in spring 2016. Departing the Ramada, the tour route wound through downtown Greensburg past the Westmoreland County Courthouse and the new Seton Hill University Arts Centers. Following Route 136 west, the group traveled on to the town of Herminie catching the Clay Pike and Mars Hill Road through the countryside to Sutersville along the Youghiogheny River just north of West Newton. They then traveled south to West Newton between the CRX rail lines and the scenic Youghiogheny River. The building had originally been a Willys Knight dealership in the 1920's. Keith is very much a Ford man and had some beautiful Model A's on display including a Woodie, which he recently finished restoring. He found the Woodie in Lancaster County, PA with over 200,000 miles on it. So it certainly earned a caring restoration in Keith's hands. Keith also does Model A Ford repair and is President of the Pittsburgh Model A Club. Other great cars in Keith's shop included a 1957 Ford retractable, 1936 Ford Convertible Coupe, 1951 Mercury and 1953 Mercury Convertible, which he has owned for 30 year and is now restoring.

In the bottom floor of his building Keith stores antique cars for others. In the corner downstairs is also an original washing bay which was once used by the Willys Knight dealership.

Bill Maurer spoke about Hemming's Magazine and his long time subscription. Bill brought old issues and subscriptions to show the members.

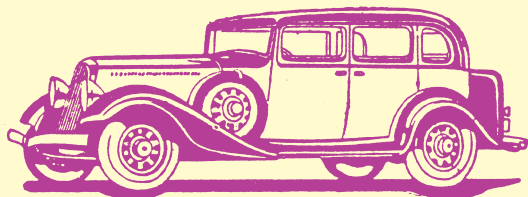
### Meeting Snacks

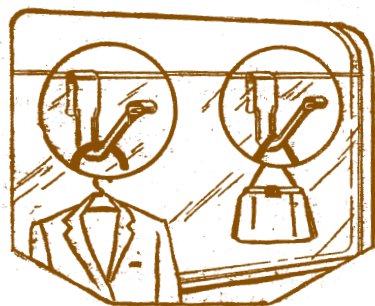
