We Need Your Help

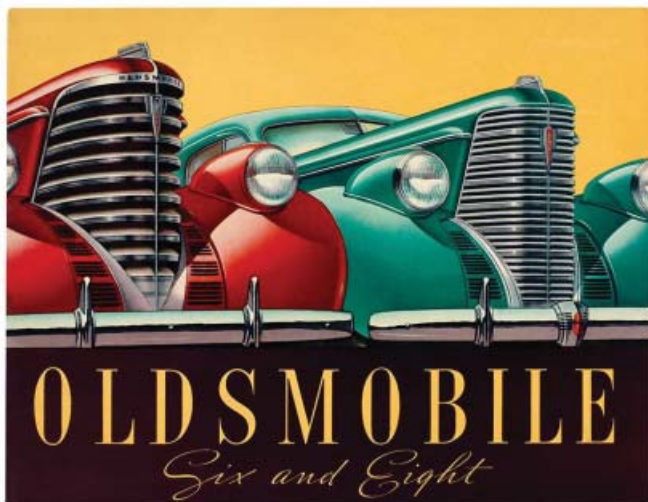

Rambling through Wisconsin for a

In June, we traveled to Hartford, Wisconsin for a joint meet with the Nash and Kissel Kar clubs. On Friday, June 24th, we took our 1946 Nash Ambassador Slipstream on a ramble through the Kettle Moraine Scenic drive in southern Wisconsin. We met at the Wisconsin Automotive Museum which was the starting point of our drive. Our first stop was the Venerable Fire Collection in the town of Slinger, WI. The collection contained thirty pieces of 'fire' apparatus dating back to 1860. There was a collection of fire boxes which the owner's son, Warren, gave us a demonstration of how a fire box sends the signal to the control room that would contact the nearest available fire house to the scene of the fire. There was also a working model of a turn-of-the-century fire alarm telegraph system that was used up into the 1970s.

The next stop was the Holy Hill Basilica located in Hubertus, WI. The church is located on one of Wisconsin's highest points at 1300 ft and it covers about 435 acres. We had lunch at the church's café.

We continued on our driving tour to the town of Dheinsville and the group visited a building nearby that had a large collection of bells. We made a stop at a quaint little town of Cedarburg that had several antique and candy shops. The tour ended with the return to the host hotel in Hartford.

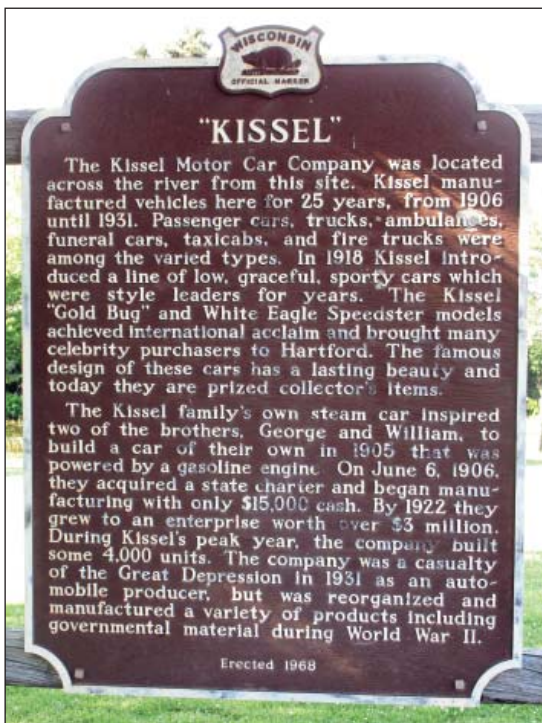

Mark Jackson reported that approximately 600 tickets were sold during the four days of the festival at Twin Lakes Park. He thanked all who helped sell tickets, displayed their antique cars and helped with set up and tear down.

Progressive Dinner Tour

The Region's Progressive Dinner Tour took place on Sunday, July 10th. It was a beautiful day for a drive with 33 members participating. Howard and Bettyann Finney hosed the salad stop at the Megan Smith Pavilion at Mount Odin Municipal Golf Course in Greensburg. Bill and C.J. Maurer hosted the dinner stop at the Cedar Hills Club House near their home in the Belle Vernon countryside. Bob and Karla Doppelheuer hosted the dessert stop at their home in Scottdale. President DeFloria thanked all the dining stop hosts and Mark Jackson for arranging a great tour this year.

NEW BUSINESS

2016 Chance Car

For 2016 WPR Chance Car tickets offer the opportunity to win a red 1965 Mustang OR \$8,000. Alice Shaulis is handling the tickets with Mark Jackson coordinating the schedule. John Ross and John Kuhns, Sr. are storing the car in Latrobe.

John Ross Kuhns updated members present on the status of the prosecution of the young man who stole and destroyed the Region's original 2016 Chance Car, a red 1966 Mustang, in May. John has been in touch with the people working with this case. Three felony charges are involved. In addition to destroying our chance car the thief did substantial damage to structures at the construction site. The authorities informed John Ross that the thief would be tried as a youth since he is 14 years old, so the penalties would not be as severe as if he was tried as an adult. John expressed that he thought the youth should apologize to the Region members, not be allowed to drive until he is 21 and perform some kind of meaningful community service. The youth will be going before a judge in the near future.

Mecum Auction Bus Tour

John Ross Kuhns reported that the tour to the Harrisburg Mecum Auction could not happen this year due to much higher bus rental costs. The cost of the mini bus which we have used the past two years increased greatly. Other bus companies were either booked or could not offer anything smaller than a 40 passenger bus. Such a bus is expensive to charter, and those interested in going this year numbered around 14. We may be able to do this trip in the future if we can fill a larger bus, but we will

have to plan much earlier. The situation with the mini bus company this year caught us by surprise.

Hershey Bus Tour

With the loss of the mini bus service for the Mecum Auction, it looks like the Hershey bus trip will only happen if WPR members rent a large van. John Ross is looking into options.

Tour to the National U.S. Air Force Museum in Dayton, Ohio – Al Friend

The tour to the Air Force Museum will be August 19-21. Al Friend reported that about 40 people will be participating. Rooms at the Hope Hotel may still be available. The tour is a joint tour with the Pittsburgh Corvair Club. A registration form and tour flyer are included in the July Western Round Up.

Al passed around a schematic drawing of the museum. He also informed those present that there are electric scooters available at the museum for those who have difficulty walking. Al emphasized that this will be an extraordinary opportunity to hear stories about different war time aircraft from veterans who served as crew members. He also mentioned that a gentleman named Dave Donitelli will be attending the tour. He was in New York during 9/11 and worked on the restoration of the subway, which was under the Twin Towers. Dave has offered to share some stories on his experiences at that time.

September Tour – Diana Anderson

Diana Anderson informed members of a driving tour she is working on scheduling to the newly remodeled Frick Car and Carriage House and Clayton, the home of the Henry Clay Frick family in the Point Breeze neighborhood of Pittsburgh. This tour would be on Saturday, September 24th. The Frick Museum needs to have a head count two weeks before the tour. A registration flyer will be in the August issue of the *Round-Up*.

October Pumpkin Run Tour – Cris and Molly Detwiler

Cris and Molly are setting up a driving tour to the Fall Festival at Ohiopyle, PA on Saturday, October 15th, which will be highlighted by a buckwheat cake (thin like a crepe and oh, so good) and pancake supper. Parking will be limited and along the street sides. Cris advised that you may want to drive a modern car rather than risking something happening to your antique.

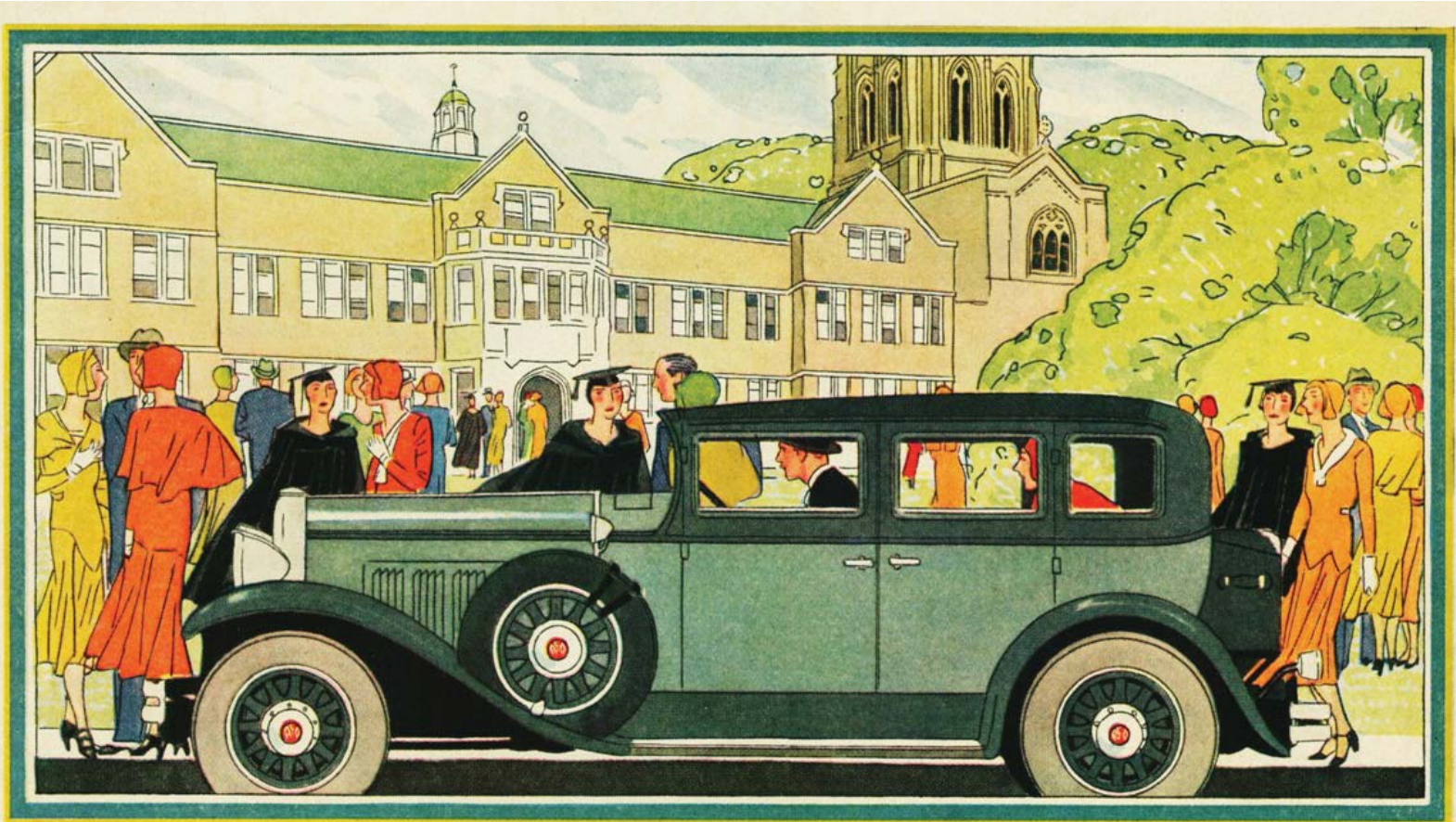
