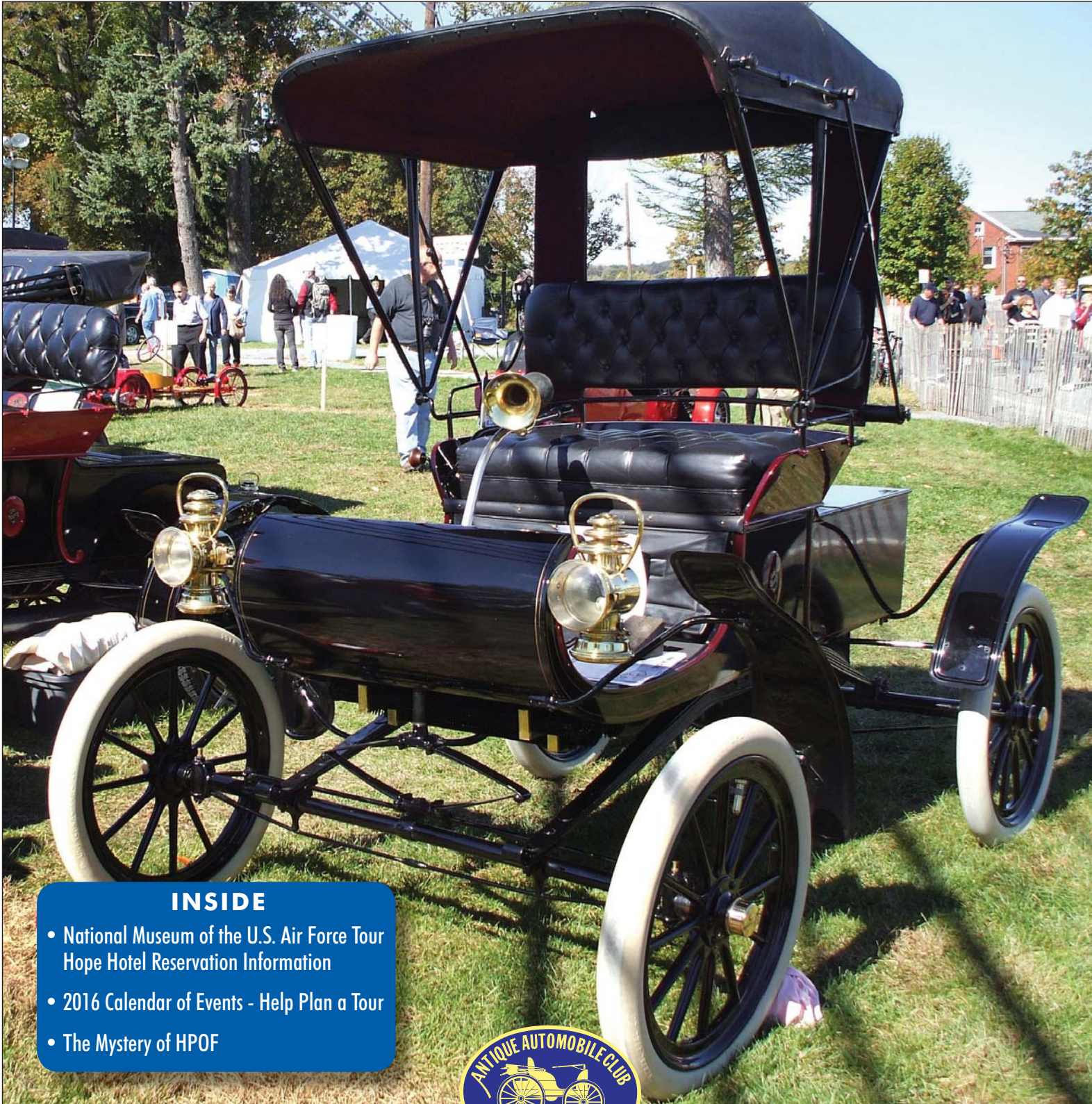

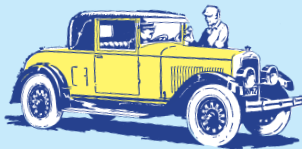

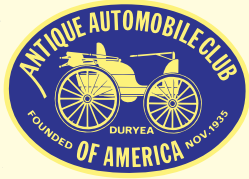

Thanks to Dave Lizza. He talked me into coming to a few meetings, and soon after I joined the club and have belonged ever since.


Over time the club has continued to grow and this means more friends and more good times.

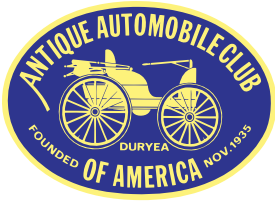

# The Mystery of HPOF

The HPOF (Historic Preservation of Original Features) class has been around for a number of years now. Long enough that we have used our experience and feedback to bring out our third major revision several years ago. It's popular enough that I count over 180 cars registered for HPOF at Hershey this year. Our team really has our work cut out for us!

So, what's the mystery? Over these last few years, I've had a number of members ask me about HPOF - how are the cars judged? What are the criteria? First off, we evaluate the cars on a score sheet that's very different from the class judging sheet. Anyone can look at an example of the sheet that's printed in the AACA Judging Guidelines. You can buy one at the AACA merchandise table, pick one up as you enter your next Judging School or view it online at [www.aaca.org](http://www.aaca.org). Look it over and you can score your own car. Keep in mind that we don't count off for normal wear items that are replaced with period correct items, such as belts, hoses, clamps, battery and tires. That's the same as the guidelines for class judging.

Also, I encourage any owner to come by my HPOF CJE (Continuing Judges Education) presentation that I give at any meet following the Judges Breakfast. At the Hershey meet, the CJE's are presented immediately following the school on Friday afternoon. I'm always happy to clear up the mystery...

If you're not sure if your car will "make it", I encourage you to bring it to a meet and let us have a look at it. If we're unable to certify your car, we'll point you toward DPC (Drivers Participation Class) or class judging.



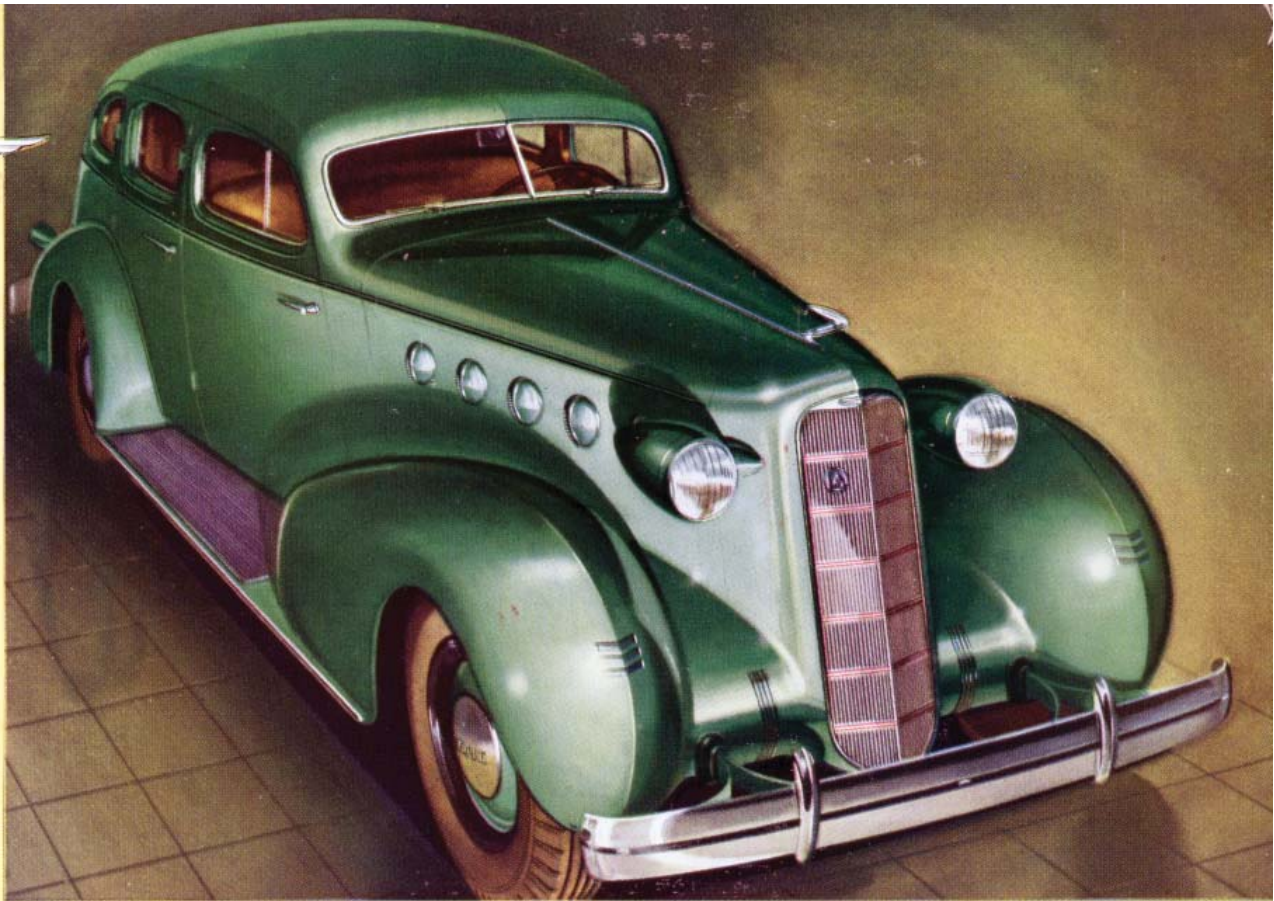
