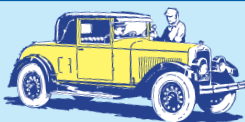

Westmoreland Cleanways Presentation on the Fugitive Tire Program & other Recycling Services Highlights Region's April Meeting

At the Western PA Region's April monthly meeting, members enjoyed a special presentation by Ellen Keefe, Executive Director of Westmoreland Cleanways. Ellen talked about Westmoreland Cleanways' Fugitive Tire Program and how it has developed over the years. Our region has helped sponsor this program for the last three years with financial contributions from our Chance Car proceeds.

Through the Fugitive Tire Program, area youth groups work with Westmoreland Cleanways to remove carelessly discarded old tires from natural areas. These groups earn money collecting the tires, and the tires are then recycled or disposed of properly. Ellen presented a colorful Powerpoint with photos of young people collecting mountains of tires which they rolled up steep banks out forests and even pulled out of the Youghiogheny River using canoes. Many of these groups really enjoy this hard work and the results so much that they return each year ready for a new tire round up.

Ellen also gave a history of Westmoreland Cleanways from its birth as PA CleanWays to its transformation into Westmoreland Cleanways and its recent affiliation with Keep America Beautiful. Westmoreland Cleanways offers many specialized recycling services including household

hazardous wastes and electronic appliances. Old televisions have now become a challenge to dispose of properly and are showing up more and more dumped in natural areas. Westmoreland Cleanways is currently the only resource in the region where people can take unwanted televisions for recycling and proper disposal.

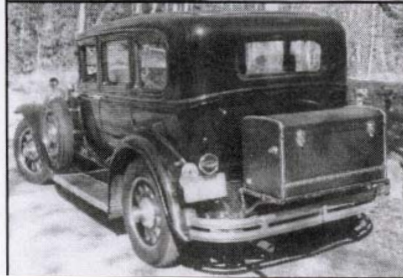
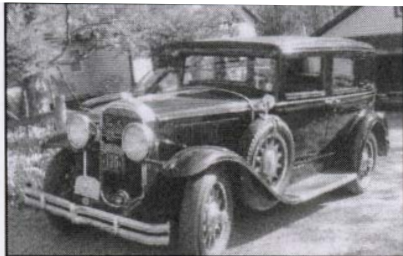

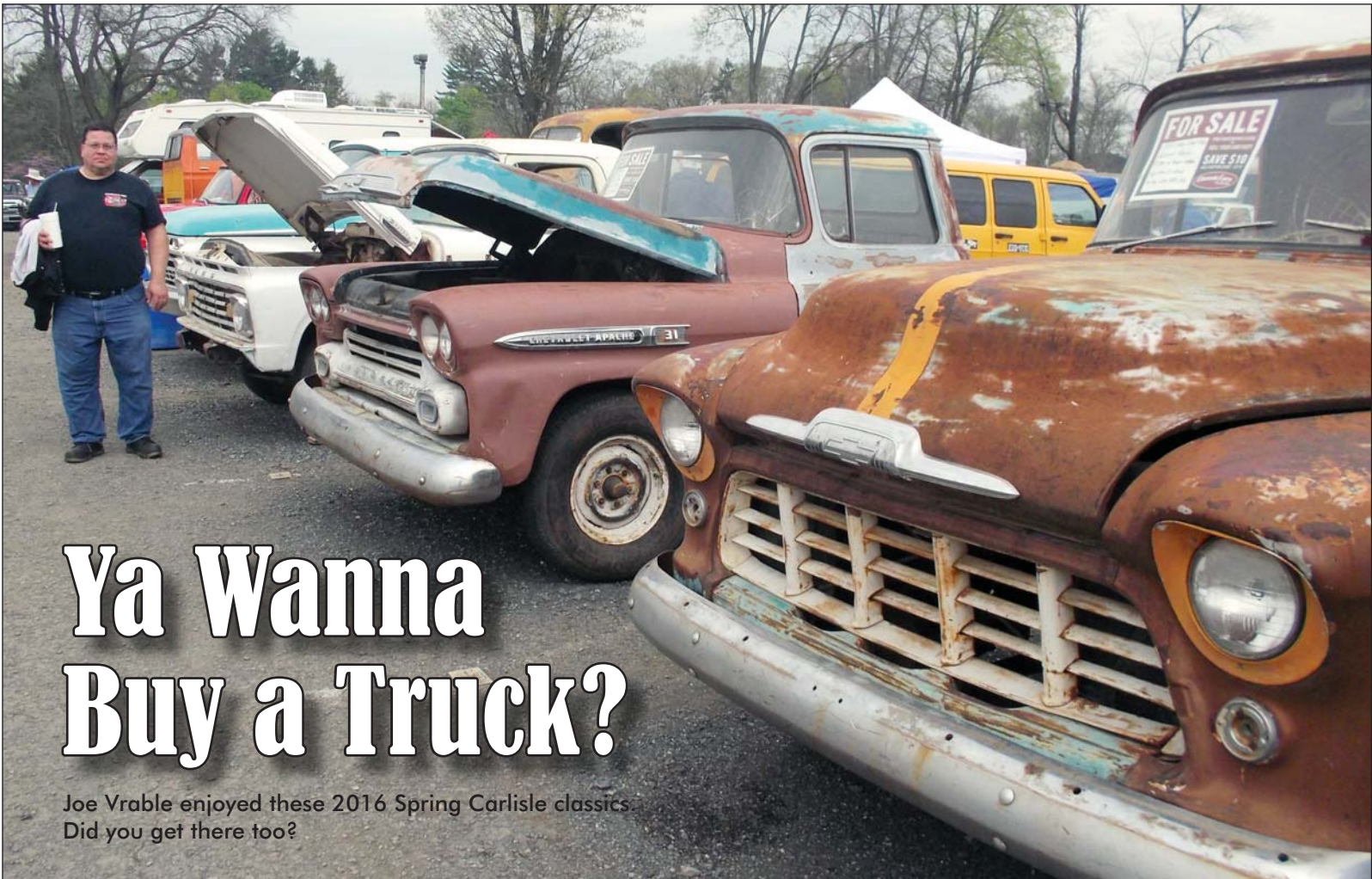
