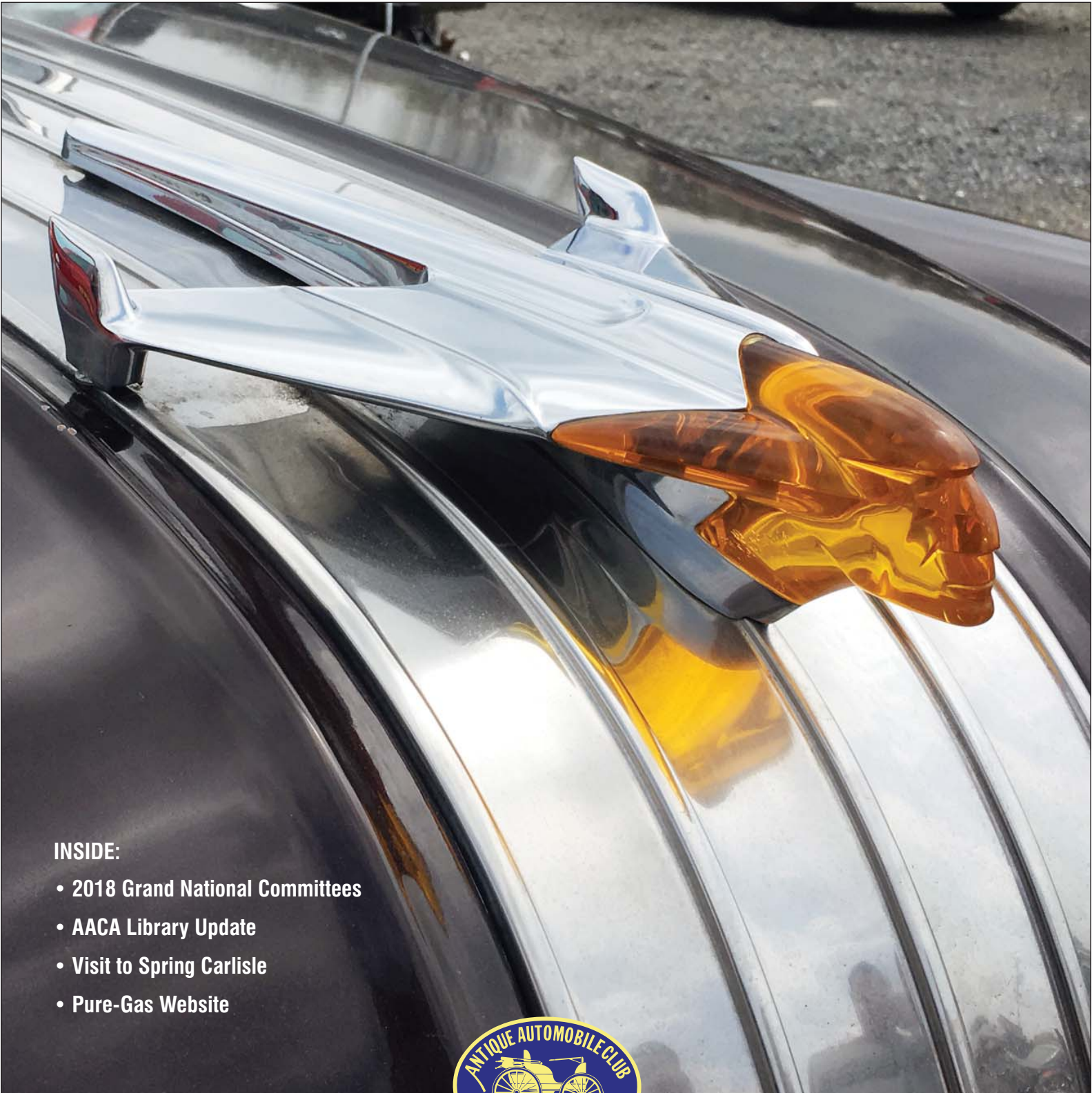

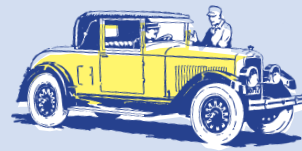

The Western PA Region AACA lost a legend on April 8, 2017 with the passing of long-time member Ruth Kunkle of Penn Township. She was 96. Ruth and husband Morris were pillars of the Western PA Region and AACA with Morris serving as Region President in 1960 and AACA National President in 1970.

During World War II Ruth served in the Womens Army Service Pilots (WASPs). Her duties included ferrying planes between bases. Often these planes were unproven or recently repaired. She also flew as a tow pilot towing targets in a pattern so that anti-aircraft ground crews could practice shooting. She never had to make an emergency landing and was never accidentally shot down. Many years later in March 2010, Ruth was recognized for her courageous service with a Congressional Gold Medal.

Both accomplished pilots, Ruth and Morris Kunkle also shared a passion for antique autos and owned some outstanding examples including a 1911 Stevens Duryea AA Tourer which they owned for 50 years. After enjoying many Western PA Region and AACA tours and shows with this car the Kunkles sold it to Jim and Arlene Adams of Florida. It is now on display at the AACA Museum in Hershey and scheduled to be on exhibition until November 1, 2017.

Regis Jackson graduated from Robert Morris University in Moon Township near Pittsburgh on May 6th. He made the Dean's List too.

1914 - 1915 Ford Buying Incentive Shared Profits

Editor's Note: WPR member Bill Holtzer shared this interesting pamphlet on a buyer incentive offered by the Ford Motor Company 1914 -1915. Ford's success was built on producing an easy-to-drive, easy-to-maintain, quality automobile that people could afford. This is an example of their one of their brilliant marketing strategies, which foreshadowed today's auto manufacturer rebates.



New FORD Prices

Effective August 1st, 1914

Guaranteed against a reduction up to August 1st, 1915, but not guaranteed against an advance. These prices prevail in the United States of America only. All cars fully equipped f. o. b. Detroit, and these prices are only for the United States of America.

- Roadster.....\$440.00
- Touring Car..... 490.00
- Town Car..... 690.00

This is a cut of \$60 in the price of each car. They are the same Ford cars in all specifications and qualifications we have been selling right along, only there are refinements and betterments being made to the car all the time. The continuous production with highly efficient workmen must naturally tend to such refinements and betterments.

Retail Buyers to Share in Profits

Retail buyers of Ford cars from August 1st, 1914 to August 1st, 1915 to share in the profits earned by the Company during that period to the extent of from \$40 to \$60 per car on each car they buy, to be paid sometime during August, 1915, provided we sell and deliver 300,000 or more new cars during this period.

Let us get this plain.

First: There is a direct reduction of \$60 in the price of each new Ford car. There can be no misunderstanding in this fact.

Second: There is no guarantee that the present new prices will not be advanced and orders are accepted only for immediate delivery.

The proposed Profit-Sharing to Retail Buyers means that if we sell and deliver 300,000 new Ford cars between August 1st, 1914 and August 1st, 1915, we will hand back to the retail buyers of new Ford cars between twelve and eighteen millions of dollars in profits. For each individual retail buyer of a new Ford car during that period, from \$40 to \$60 on each new Ford car bought within the time specified.

To sell 300,000 cars in twelve months will be only a normal increase in our Sales and Production Departments, and we are almost confident of doing it.

It will be quickly understood that profits are earned through savings in producing and selling. As our production and sales grow larger, it means that it will cost less per car to manufacture and sell.

When we buy on a basis of a 300,000 car production, we can purchase materials at a lower cost than we could for a production of 221,888 cars (the number which we built and sold from August 1st, 1913 to August 1st, 1914). So if we sell and deliver 300,000 new cars (or more) between August 1st, 1914 and August 1st, 1915, we will be able to return to each retail buyer of a new Ford car from \$40 to \$60 as his share of the profits.

The number of cars sold and delivered each month will be published monthly in the FORD TIMES mailed free to any address.

This profit-sharing plan is entirely distinct and separate from the reduction of \$60 in the price.

Note:

Retail buyers will not be permitted to participate in this profit-sharing, until the original copy of their Buyers' Order and Agreement, properly filled in and signed by the purchaser, has been filed with the Company as evidence of purchase. The Bill of Sale will be executed at the Home Office of this Company only, and will then be returned with the proper endorsement direct to the purchaser.

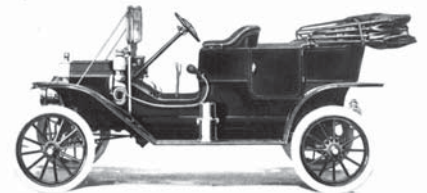

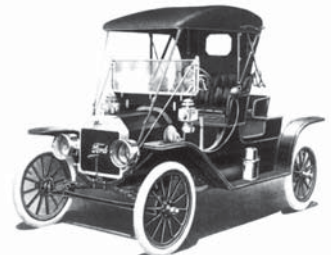

Al Friend passed out brochures on the 2017 Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix.

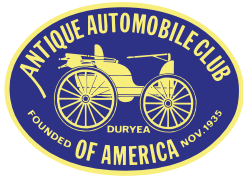
Cris Detwiler informed all that the **Ohiopyle Buckwheat Pancake Supper** was this coming weekend.

Library Update

2016 was another great year for YOUR AACA Library & Research Center. Two highlights include receiving the Don O'Reilly collection and the completion of our homebuilt 16mm film scanner.

The Don O'Reilly racing collection includes thousands of early NASCAR programs, photographs, entrance forms, tally sheets and more. We took receipt of the collection in Eugene, Oregon and needed a 54-foot trailer to get all of it back to Hershey! Work continues on the sorting, cataloging and the eventual digitization of the collection. If anyone is interested in getting their hands dirty with this project, please reach out to library staff.

Our 16mm film scanner is a homebuilt unit and we used a crowdfunding campaign to finance the project. With your help we raised more than \$11,000 for the scanner. We are currently in the process of digitizing our collection of over 300 films. Once the films are digitized, we are uploading them to our YouTube page where anyone with an internet connection can watch for

free. Of course, if you need still need a film on DVD for a region or chapter meeting or event, we'd be happy to supply you with one.

As we look into 2017, we are extremely excited to announce that the AACA Library Bookmobile will hit the road this year! Our 1955 Chevrolet bookmobile originally served the residents of Anderson County, SC from 1956-1990. It was donated to us in 2012 and underwent a total restoration. After it makes the rounds at AACA events, it will become an amazing ambassador to the old car hobby as it visits schools, parades, retirement communities and (hopefully) a local event near you.

Our general reference collection, the heart of the library, continues to grow with over 1-million pieces of sales literature, manuals, ads, photographs and more. In addition we have close to 6,500 reference books on our shelves. The collection also contains early automotive periodicals such as *Cycle & Automobile Trade Journal*, *MoToR*, *Motor Age*, *Autocar* and the *Commercial Car Journal*. You can explore our Online Catalog at www.aacalibrarycatalog.org.

The Library is now open six days a week; Monday - Saturday, from 8:00 A.M. - 4:00 P.M. We invite everyone to stop by to do research, view the facility and see our 1906 Mitchell, 1929 Harley-Davidson and 1940 Ford. If you can't visit the library in person, be sure take advantage of the 1 1/2 hours of free research that every AACA member is entitled to.

The Library and Research Center is a wealth of knowledge and we look forward to hearing from you soon!

Joe and Mark's Annual Visit to Spring Carlisle

Western PA Region member Joe Vrable and I have been friends since ninth grade. (That's 47 years ago.) Through the years, one of our favorite things to talk about has always been old cars.

We graduated from Hempfield High School in 1974. At the time, Joe had a 1948 Dodge Club Coupe and I had a 1948 Chevy Stylemaster sedan. Joe always had the mechanical know how and guts to take on things that befuddled me. He and my dad taught me much about old cars along the way.
