It was determined that the 'real' problem with the truck was the throttle position sensor. With the problem fixed, we travelled back to Wisconsin to pick up the trailer with the Nash then on to the next concours show in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Before taking the trailer to the next show, the Nash tires had to be changed from radials to bias-ply.

We arrived at the show field that was located on Lake Michigan. While lining up to enter the show field, we followed a 1962 pink Kaiser Jeep 'Surrey' with pink striped seats. We were told that the pink Jeep was used as a model for a Tonka toy. We had eight Nashes in our class that ranged from a 1921 Standard Six to a 1954 Nash Ambassador. There were 180 cars, boats and motorcycles on display. We won 'Best in Class' for the Nash group. Some of the attendees pointed out that all cars on the show field had grease spots on the paint. We noticed that the food vendors were located near the show field and the breeze from the lake dispersed hamburger grease onto the cars. After the show, we drove back to Green Bay to park the trailer and visit family for the week.

The following weekend, we hitched up the trailer and

drove south to Milwaukee for the 13th Annual Concours that was located at Veteran's Park in Milwaukee. Trailer parking was on site at the show on Lake Michigan. There were two host hotels available to stay during the show. We stayed at The Plaza in downtown Milwaukee. We were told that the hotel was built in 1925 and the building was decorated in the Art Deco style that included a diner/lunch counter with peninsular style counter and chrome bar stools. In the hotel lobby, we saw a telephone switchboard too.

On Saturday, we participated in a 60 mile round-trip driving tour from downtown to a collector's home near Cedarburg, Wisconsin. There were about 30 cars ranging from a 1929 Rolls Royce to a 2017 Ford GT. The gentlemen had a house for his cars behind his home. We were instructed to drive our car to a 'circle' for our class. There were 12 vehicles registered in the class named Cruising America. 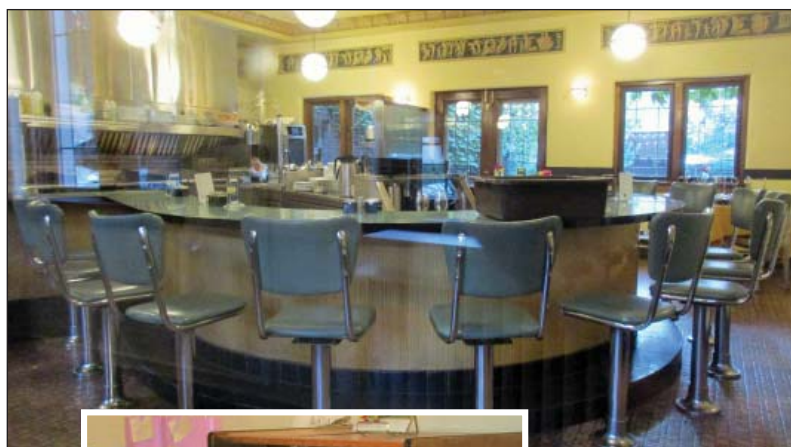

The Road Less Traveled By

The Museum in Gun Barrel, Colorado dedicated to Carroll Shelby

This past May while driving through the town of Gun Barrel, Colorado on the road less traveled by, I visited a museum dedicated to race car legend and automobile innovator Carroll Shelby. While the exterior of the one room museum was simple in design, the interior contained some of the most fearsome automobiles ever created. Among the displays was the very first Cobra built by Carroll Shelby. Other historic Cobras were also present as well as the Ford GT40s which defeated Ferrari at the 1966 and 1967 24 hours of LeMans. There were Cobra Daytona Coupes, Shelby Mustangs, Sunbeam Tigers, and Ford “lightweights” from the 1960s. It was a race car fan’s fantasy land.

Besides the great exhibit of cars, the memorabilia displayed on the walls and in the cabinetry highlighted many of Team Shelby’s most accomplished members including Ken Miles, Peter Brock, Bob Bondurant, Dan Gurney, A.J. Foyt, Phil Hill, and Sir John Whitmore. Original automobile advertisements from the 1960s could be seen throughout the museum, and the write-ups concerning each car on display truly took you back

in time to an era when automobile manufacturers followed the slogan of “win on Sunday, sell on Monday.”

The Shelby Museum is located in the town of Gun Barrel, Colorado, just outside the city of Boulder. It is open only on Saturdays, and the price of admission is \$5.00.

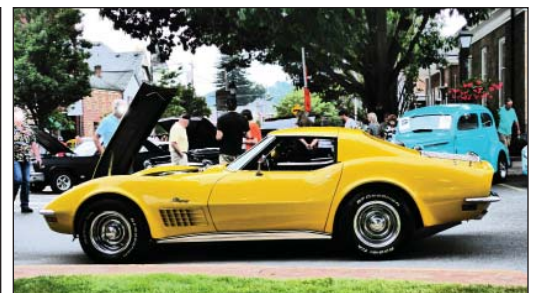

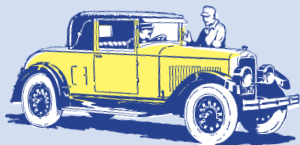

Name That Car
