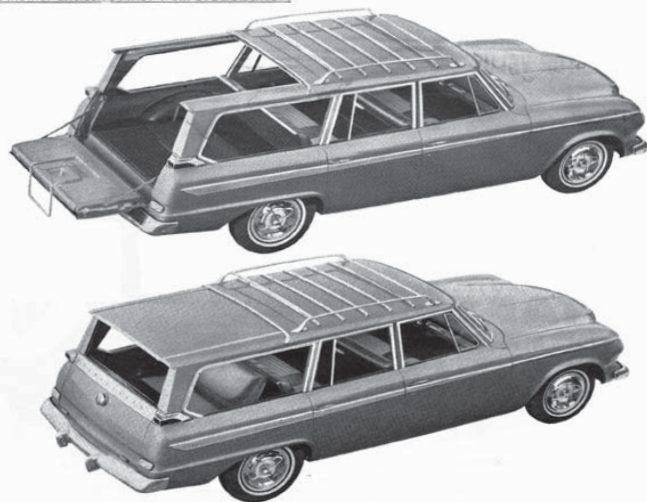

The \$8,000 cash option is also available again. Chance Car tickets will be available to sign out at the February 20th monthly meeting. This will be the region's 53rd Chance Car.

Sheila and Joe Kurtz will be handling the signing out and returning of the tickets this year. Mark Jackson will handle the scheduling, and the car will be stored in Latrobe once again by John Ross and John Kuhns, Sr.

The winner will be taken from the first four digit PA Lottery number drawn at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 27, 2018. If the winning number is not drawn on that day the ticket will continue to play each following day at 7:00 p.m. until a winner is determined.

Sheila and Joe will have tickets to sign out at the monthly meetings. Arrangements can be made to get more tickets between meetings by contacting Sheila. Mark Jackson will also have a limited supply of tickets available in Greensburg.

Please turn in all ticket stubs in numerical order. Please turn in ticket money using a personal check made payable to Western PA Region AACA. The Western PA Region directors ask that all Chance Car tickets, sold and unsold, be returned to Sheila and Joe Kurtz by the October monthly meeting on October 16, 2018.

Please give John Ross Kuhns 24 hours notice to arrange to take out the Chance Car to sell tickets. Please also be sure to fill the gas tank after taking the car out and keep the car as clean as possible. Expenses for Chance Car gas and event entry fees will be reimbursed. Save your receipts and turn them in to WPR Treasurer Mark Jackson.

As in previous years, sell 40 tickets and earn a free 2019 Western PA Region membership. For every 40 tickets sold

beyond the first 40, earn a voucher good towards any Western PA Region event or apparel.

For apparel purchases, turn in your receipt and you will be reimbursed for the value of the vouchers you wish to apply towards the purchase. For apparel visit the Big Frog store, Route 30 West, Greensburg by Five Guys Burgers and Chipolte across from the Wal-Mart Plaza. They have our logo on file. Ask for the Western PA Region logo on file under Mark Jackson.

With all the excitement building this year - AACA Grand National, etc., and some new sales venues, it would be great to have a ticket "sell out" by October 16th.

Chance Car ticket sales help keep our activity and event costs reasonable, and help assure their quality and variety in promoting the enjoyment and restoration of antique automobiles. The crowd was estimated at over three million people. The Sheraton was in the heart of the action. No matter what room you were in at the Sheraton that day you could hear the roar of the crowd outside. That was a lot of positive energy.

40 Million Fire Extinguishers Recalled

Just recently a recall was announced involving 40 million fire extinguishers manufactured by Kidde. The recall involves 134 models of Kidde fire extinguishers manufactured between January 1, 1973 and August 15, 2017, including models that were previously recalled in March 2009 and February 2015. Be advised that some of the recalled extinguishers were sold under names other than Kidde (i.e. Fuller Brush, Honeywell, Montgomery Ward, Sears and other names). <https://inmarmarketaction.com/kidde/> Be advised that this link has the list of recalled extinguishers. It also lets you submit your request for a replacement extinguisher after you provide your name, address, the model extinguisher and serial number. It verifies that your extinguisher is being recalled and submits your request for a replacement.

If you do not want to submit your request online, you can contact Kidde via telephone to find out if a fire extinguisher is included in the recall or to get a replacement. Contact Kidde at 855-271-0773 between 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. EST Monday - Friday (excluding holidays), or between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. during the weekend to determine whether your extinguishers are affected. Given how many AACA members have fire extinguishers for their vehicles, we have no doubt that some AACA members have extinguishers that are being recalled. Please take action on this situation immediately and be sure to share this information with all of your region and chapter members as soon as possible.

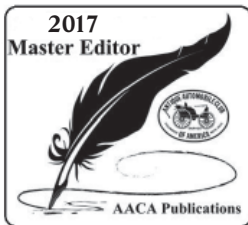
