





Name That Car

January/February's Car



John Ross Kuhns was the first to correctly identify this car as a 1932 Ford. Joe Vrable and Jim Heatherington also correctly identified the car. Jim guessed why the S&H Green Stamps were on the windshield, but he did not feel that they were on the correct side.

When I was a kid, I remember people talking about some folks using S&H Green Stamps as temporary, "fake out" inspection stickers when they could not get their cars inspected. From a distance, when the vehicle was moving, the stamps looked like an inspection sticker and could possibly prevent a pull-over by the police. However, when parked, the joke was over.

At one time Pennsylvania required two inspections per year. It took a lot of mechanical diligence to keep a vehicle in good repair. My dad did all of his own mechanical work for years. At the time, he told me that Pennsylvania required two inspections per year because of our hills and winding roads. The state wanted to be sure the brakes and all were safe. He also said that the garages and parts people made a lot of money this way. He used many pop rivets, coffee cans and gallons of Black Magic putty to get our car and truck bodies through inspection, and was forever adjusting brakes.

The only one who used S&H Green Stamps in our house was my mom, who stuck them in books to redeem for cool stuff.
